

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

It gives me great pleasure to present my report to this meeting.

The past term of office was a difficult one in a sense that our life style has changed so much that we are unable to devote the time we previously devoted to sport. Added to that is the everchanging sports environment as well as other non-sporting interests that sports has to compete with to keep and develop its membership. How often have we nurtured our juniors just to find that after standard nine they disappear into the wood works. Nevertheless sport from a purely health and character building point of view is still very important and that is why as a sports organisation we must continue to provide sports.

Now let us examine in a nutshell the state of our Club.

We continue to provide soccer for our juniors and one team for seniors and the same for cricket. To encourage female sports a tennis day was held. Financially the Club is on a sound footing and as far as the Progress Ground is concerned the sporting and financial implications are still being debated while we continue to look after the facility.

What of the future?

I am convinced that we need to hire skilled people to run our sports which we as part-timers are unable to provide due to lack of time or lack of skill. In this way we will allow people who are doing their bit- no matter how small- to do it more diligently and effectively and with a sense of satisfaction. As soon as a person feels "over burdened" we are going to loose that person. On top of it the Club will then also raise its standard of administration and play.

As far as female sports is concerned the tennis day unearthed players who can hold their own and therefore we must make a concerted effort to provide more opportunities for them to play competitively even if we have to "bus" them.


On a community level various fun sports events must be organised- even every two months- so that members "feel" that they are part of a sports club and will identify with it i.r.o. all projects and events organised by us. Also it will bring our cricket and soccer players to meet and socialise.

As far as the development of the Progress Ground is concerned I have a few pre-requisition before we undertake financial responsibility on a large scale eg Club House. Our present two codes must be consolidated on a long-term basis ie playing wise as well as administratively. At the same time we must utilise/explore present resources- ours as well as City Councils- to its maximum. Simultaneously we must identify other community organisations - schools, sports clubs etc- with whom we can go into partnership and share resources. The last thing we want is everything but the playing of sport!

To round up I want to quote the late SAMORA MACHEL:

'THE SUCCESS OF THE REVOLUTION DEPENDS ON THE TINY DAILY ACTS OF EACH OF US'.
i.e. the success of the CLUB depends on each and every one of us.

Lastly my thanks to my fellow officials and all the members of the Club and congratulations to all the trophy winners. Remember, when you enjoy what you are doing success comes naturally.

1998/1999 SEASONS.**

It gives me great pleasure to present my report for the 1998/1999 seasons.

The 1998 season ran relatively smoothly as far as the administration was concerned. It was pleasing to note that new blood had been injected into the soccer structures at the manager level. There is still an absence of new blood at senior administration level. The registration of our teams to the LSA went off very smoothly because of our pre-planning. The collection of the season fees was also very good. This gave the managers and coaches more time to concentrate on the teams' development and improve their performances. Most of our teams performed above average for this season. Our training sessions were also well attended which showed the commitment of the players. Our managers and coaches would benefit from special clinics before the season commences and in turn impart their knowledge and new techniques to the players. On the down side, the attendance at the presentation of trophies function was very poor which reflected on the parent's lack of interest in the performance and achievements of their children.

The 1999 season started with a lack of pre-planning. This led to problems in administration as well as in collecting the season fees. Additional expenses for late registrations could have been avoided. Our expenditure has exceeded the income generated. We need to go on a fund raising drive in order to meet our budgeted expenditure.

The current log positions of our teams is also very disheartening as most of the teams are performing below average. However, attendances at training sessions and the general morale of the of the teams seem to be good. We hope that in the new season we will see an improvement in their performances.

I wish to place on record my sincere thanks to my fellow officials, management, coaches and the members for their co-operation and assistance in making my task as easy as possible.



REPORT OF THE CHAIRMAN OF THE CRICKET SUB-CLUB FOR THE 1998/1999 SEASON.

Season 1998/99 was high lighted by cricket WORLD CUP.

JUNIOR CRICKET :

Junior cricket continued its downward slide in the clubs and the region. Our club had three junior teams. Under 15, under 13 and under 11. They were affiliated to the Lenasia Youth League.

The season started very positively with all the teams participating in league fixtures. Other clubs started defaulting, which disrupted the league. All the fixtures were brought to a standstill. Our under 13 team performed the best in the limited fixtures. In the knockout competition all three teams performed well. The under 13 team reached the finals.

There were excess players in each team. The players were keen and came regularly. There was no senior support to run the teams.

The under 11 team was run by Paresh Govan and Yogesh Naran. The under 13 team was run by Satish Nathoo and assisted by Harish Bhowan. The under 15 team was managed by Rasik Gopal.

We have many talented players and if given the opportunity can reach the highest levels.

The major problems are lack of senior support and poor functioning of the local (Lenasia) junior cricket structure. We in cricket have discussed these problems extensively and believe that, to keep cricket alive in our clubs and in Lenasia, we need to employ knowledgeable people to help in the running of our cricket. With senior help we could then play our junior teams in other well organized junior structures in areas outside Lenasia.

SENIOR CRICKET :

The 1998/9 season started on a faltering note. Before the start of the season two teams were registered to play with a signed up roll call of 26 players. As only 15 players reported for duty one team was withdrawn before a single ball was bowled.



Nana conducted coaching sessions for the junior and senior players.

As for the 1999/2000 season, we have affiliated a Sunday team as well as a Saturday team composed of seniors and last years U15 players. Hopefully these juniors will then be promoted to the Sunday team within a few seasons.

We have advertised in the local newspapers for people who may want to help for some financial reward. We also want to employ Jateen Nana as a coach to our club.

Due to unforeseen circumstances our annual presentation function was delayed. It will be held on the 17th September 1999.

It is a major challenge to keep cricket alive. Mr. Ajit Gandabhai deserves special mention for this efforts to keep cricket going. Assistance from anybody in the club to promote cricket will be most welcome.
