accommodation supplied to them. Further if as I surmise, the original
tickets were purchased from you at Cala Road, would you be good
enough to supply me with the date of purchase, and the numbers of the
lost tickets, in order to enable to obtain a refund from the
Authorities here in Johannesburg.

Dear Sir,

My niece Millicient has arrived safely. I thank you for the services you rendered to her.

I have just learned with surprise that Millicient has not yet commenced her lessons on the Organ. As you will remember I wrote to you in the middle of the First term, and sent you some money, in which was a pro rata amount for lessons on the Organ for the remaining part of the term .

The following term in August 1933. I sent you a cheque for £5.15.0. (five pounds fifteen shillings). this was £5.0.0. (five pounds) for School fees, and the balance namely £. 15.0. (fifteen shillings) for Organ lessons, subsequently I received an official account for incidentals, which amount I duly paid.

I shall be pleased if you will kindly inform me, why my niece has not received the Organ instruction for which I have already paid and specified that she should receive.

I should also be pleased if you would kindly send me an itemised account of the £4. (four pounds) which I posted to you for Millicient's Railway, and other travelling expenses; the return Railway fare from Durban to Johannesburg is £3.9.9. (three pounds nine shillings

and nine pence), surmising that the fare from Amanzimtoti to Durban would be in the vicinity of two to three shillings, I concluded that there would still be a sufficiently large amount over, and above these two items, to pay for her comforts whilst in the train; as I understand that the child did not have any money given to her before her departure, which may have been an oversight, I am afraid she suffered some deprivation unnecessarily, for which I am extremely sorry, being fully satisfied personally that her needs had been duly catered for.

Should any balance left over have been already allocated to some other account, of which I am not conversant that of course disposes of the amount in question, in any case I should greatly appreciate if accounts in their entirety for the future be posted to me, and no deductions made from any sum which I may from time to time send to my niece.


Dear Sir,
