There is a most urgent necessity for the a pointrent of Native Cornessioners .- not so much for the administration of justice amongst the Matives (as con templated by Law No. 4 of 1885) but for the purpose of assisting in the pacification of the country, and acting as advisory officers and corrissioners in commection with such natters as are referred to in paragraphs Nos. 12 , I3, I4, and I5 of this report.

Iwo appointments of Acting Commissioners have been made: one by hajor-General F. .. Kitchener in Sikukumiland and the other ,I understand, by the Director of milit ry Intelligence, Arry Headquarters.

or R. Haigh, the Acting Cormissioner, Sikukumiland, is wa well recommended by Major-General Kitchener, and Colonel Handarson the D ractor of Military Intelligence. He was appointed on the 28th of April last, his authes being defined as unuer:-

In select I2 good Natives as Police, the number to be increased to meet the requirements of keeping order. To deal with all Native squabbles through the Chiefs, being careful to exercise discreet authority. To enquire into natters of dispute between Chiefs, and report the same to the Military Governor, Pretoria Reports have been received from har Haigh fr m time to time, chiefly or ratters of dispute between Sikukuni and ralukutu.
