Sobukwa Letters

Here is the script. I am glad that we agree in principle about the way it might be improved.

If I may summerize my thoughts -

- (1) Many of the letters are not interesting enough to merit publication.
- (2) There is too much 'small talk' in them that could usefully be omitted.
- (3) One way to treat them might be to group them under broad themes and thus to show the development and changes that take place in Sobukwe's thoughts during his incarceration.
- (4) You quite rightly point out the importance of the 'small talk' that abows how different his treatment was from that of others of the political prisoners - Nelson Mandels, for example. Mandels though, according to the South African Government, is. I believe, a convicted criminal, not just a political prisoner.
- (5) Linking commentaries might provide an acceptable way of presenting the material.
- (6) Length is important, I think, but too long a book unless it was to be a definitive biography - would defeat its purpose. The price would be too high.

All the time one comes back to the feeling and belief that a good book on Schukwe is needed, that his example and his judgement are especially needed now.
