# 7. General

Mr R.Garda gave a report on the J.C.C. meeting held the previous night. He said that the Western Districts Union were not willing to play with T.C.A., but agreed to do so on a plea from Mr M.R.Varachia.

Inter-Union Fixtures: Mr Khota reported that this issue would be discussed at the Federation Council meeting. Mr R.Garda put forward a strong case to contine with these fixtures and received good support from Mr A.Mangera.

The Chairman also supported the previous speakers by saying that inter-Union matches provided an opportunity to players to play at a higher level.

Mr Garda then outlined the system of play suggested by Mr Varachia for the establishment of a Super League, where Union teams would participate weekly on a league basis.

Mr Moyce pointed out the dangers in this system which would deplete the playing strength of individual clubs.

The Chairman said that as there were no immediate plans to implement this system, clubs must think about the scheme and develop it further later in the season.

Mr F. Saley said that club cricket should be encouraged.

Mr Desai asked if club matches would carry on while inter-Union matches were being played. It was felt that, whenever possible, club matches should continue when inter-Union matches are in progress.

Mr N.Bulbulia informed the house about the Junior League competition being played at the Queens Park grounds and appealed to the juniors to participate in this league.

Mr P.J.Bhana said that over the past few seasons no logs of the leagues have been presented. He also complained that teams from the lower leagues are not getting a chance to play at the Lenz Stadium.

The Chairman explained that at a meeting to be held the following night, an administrative body must be formed to ensure the success of the league competitions.

Clubs were reminded to make available a set of stumps and bails whenever and wherever they play.

Copies of the Union's Constitution to be made available to all clubs and officials at the next meeting.

The Chairman in chosing the meeting, thanked the councillors present for their contribution in the meeting.

Mr R.Garda offered his advice to the Councillors to learn to respect the chair when they speak by getting up from their seats.

The Chairman thanked Mr Garda for his expert guidance, and then closed the meeting at 10.55 p.m.

1. The Minutes of the First Council Meeting were read and adopted on the proposal of Mr L. Moyce and seconded by Mr R. Gopal.

# 2. Arisings from the Minutes:

- (a) Junior League: Mr Y. Omar reported that there were five teams playing in this league. Mr Bhikhoo appealed to the senior cricketers and administrators to take an interest in this league.
- (b) Mr Khota gave a lengthy report on how the Merger League was constituted and on how the grading of the teams was done. He also gave a report on the various meetings of the Merger League Committee.

# 3. Correspondence

Mr Naik will write for the "A" teams and the Manager of the "B" team to arrange for a scorer.

Sets of stumps and bails to be provided for each inter-Union match by the Managers.

The Chairman complimented the two Managers of the Union teams for their effort.

Transvaal Cricket Federation: SACBOC fixtures and Ruled of Play. Transvaal Cricket Federation: Transvaal team to play against Natal.

Transvaal Cricket Federation: Malpractices by Bharats. It was reported in this letter that Surrey Cricket Club had reported

to their Union that Bharats had signed on some players from their club without proper clearances.

Bharats confirmed that the players concerned had settled their dues with Surrey, but that the club had refused to issue discharges to these players.

The Chairman said that the Rules of Procedure had to be adhered to at all times. Teams hate recourse in cases where clearances are withheld, but no team may play any player who has not been cleared from his club and Union (if applicable).

It was established that Bharats had signed on rive players, from Surrey: J.Bechar, I.Parshotam, D.Ialoo, S.Tarsi and D.Dayal. The first three named had played for Bharats before their clearances were countersigned by the Officials of the Western Districts Union. Bharats had defaulted in playing these players without the necessary clearances and were severely reprimanded by the Chairman. It was decided that the Transvaal Cricket Federation be informed of the position as outlined above, with an appeal to review the case sympathetically.

No copy of the letter from Surrey or the Western Districts was attached to the letter from the Federation.

Mr H. Saley said that it was unfair to ask the teams in the lower divisions to pay the same amount as the first division teams, as these teams were not enjoying the same playing facilities as the sanior teams.

The Chairman explained why this levy was brought into force by the T.C.F.

# 5. Fixtures

Inter-changing of umpires: Mr Moyce said the system was unacceptable as too much time is being wasted with the present system.

A lengthy discussion ensued on this topic, and it was felt that under the circumstances and, in the absence of regular umpires, there was no alternative but to carry on with the system employed at the moment.

Teams reported that the wickets were not satisfactory, and that some of the mats were short.

Changes to Rules of Play: It was suggested that the following changes should be recommended to the Merger League Committee:

(a) Transfer pf players: no player may be allowed to transfer to another club if he has played 3 games or more for his club. This to apply in the case of sister teams where players from the senior team transfer to the junior team.

(b) Deciding on winners in case of adjournement of play:

Number of runs scored to be divided by the number of wickets fallen.

The team having the better run average per wicket to be declared the winner.

(c) Speeding up of the game: appeal to the teams to co-operate.

(d) Introduction of  $1\frac{1}{2}$  day cricket: clubs to examine the situation and report bach within 15 days on the feasibility of this scheme.

### 6. General

Mr R.Gopal asked how the teams were graded in the absence of a completed log.

The Chairman explained in detail how this was done.

Mr Mangera said that at the Merger Committee meeting to be held the next day, the position of Ermelo and Standerton teams would be discussed and that the Union's delegates to this meeting should be guided by the teams as to the Union's stand on their inclusion in the Merger League.

After a lengthy discussion, it was established that a large majority of the teams were not prepared to travel to these towns, and that our delegates should oppose any move to allow these two towns to play in the Merger League.

The meeting terminated at this point at 11.45 p.m.
