BRANCH NEWS.

Springs. This active little branch held a very good meeting during February and were pleased with a very good attendance. They were even more pleased at getting six new members at the meeting. Nell Green spoke on Banishments and Julius Malie on the franchise. Mr. Malie, especially made a strong impact on those present, amongst whom were students from Wits and Rhodes.

North-East Rand. This truly non-racial branch held a very wellattended meeting during the month at which the indefatigable Julius Malie was again a very welcome and impressive speaker. The subject for the meeting was Franchise, and the branch voted unanimously in favour of universal adult suffrage.

Yeoville and Berea/Hillbrow. held a joint meeting presenting a Symposium on the Franchise. Mr. G. Cohn put the case for Universal Adult Suffrage. Mr. Malie (again!) spoke about the interim period and Mr. J. Palmer, a Progressive, put the case for a qualified franchise. The meeting voted in favour of a Universal Adult Suffrage.

Houghton. This branch meeting was fairly well-attended and Mrs. Marion Friedman and Mr. Jack Unterhalter were the speakers. Mrs. Friedman summarised the different possibilities with regard to the franchise and Mr. Unterhalter spoke at length on the boycott. The meeting was in favour of universal adult suffrage and the boycott.

Parktown. This branch meeting was a purely business one but an interesting meeting was arranged for March. The subject will of course be the franchise and, again of course, Mr. Malie will be one of the speakers. This time he will put the case for a qualified franchise!

Other Branches. It is to be hoped that other branches will rouse themselves from the lethargy into which they seem to have fallen and try and get at least one meeting before Congress meets on March 26th and 27th.
