to inform you that in the March Quarterly  
Meeting it was exceedingly regretted that  
the question of Circuit Stewards which  
has engaged the attention of the meeting  
for the last four years, & which has  
been referred ~~to the~~ by the Supt: <sup>W. O.</sup> Revs. Barnett  
& J. Currey to the Synod was apparently not  
being taken notice of by ~~the~~ latter.

not even appear in the minutes, and  
members complained that if the question

It was resolved at a meeting of members held on the July 1909 that from this quarter onward all monies be received by the Leaders and that no leader should pay away <sup>any</sup> money received by him on behalf of the Society except it be to a Circuit Steward duly appointed by the Making Quarterly Meeting and approved by the Chairman of the District.

My dear Brother

I received a letter dated the 8th inst signed by yourself and others. I do not know what you mean by a meeting of members. I can only receive resolutions from the Quarterly Meeting; but as you are an old friend of mine I will let that pass and tell you exactly how the case stands. I consulted the Missionary Committee on the matter of which you write. My instructions are that when the Synod thinks a circuit is sufficiently developed to have circuit stewards such stewards will be duly appointed. The next Synod will decide which circuits are ready for this step. I have no doubt that Mafeking will be put on the list; but nothing can be done till the Synod meets.

In the meanwhile I am sure that you see that the resolution that you send me is both irregular and impossible. I am sure that the Leaders will loyally do their duty if you explain to them the exact situation. I hope to be in Mafeking next month.

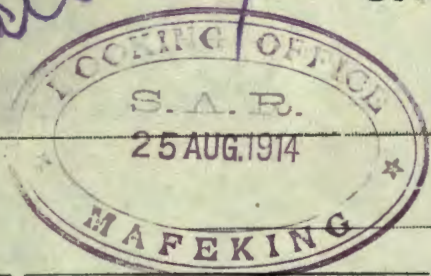
