bepalings van Art. 22(1) Wet 62/66 arresteer. Hy is te Pretoria-Sentra  
Gevangenis aangehou.

Op 81-12-11 is hy verder ooreenkomstig bepalinge van Art 6(1) Wet 83/6  
aangehou en wel te Polisie-selle, John Vorsterplein.

Om ongeveer 02h05 op Vrydag 82-02-05 is ek deur Lt.kol. Scholtz van  
hierdie personeel telefonies verwittig dat hy so pas deur die Aanklagte  
kantoorpersoneel te John Vorsterplein meegedeel is dat Aggett dood in 'n  
sel aangetref is. Hy het aan 'n stuk materiaal om sy nek en aan die  
traliwerk wat ingang tot die sel bied vasgemaak gehang.

Ek het my na John Vorsterplein gemaak waar ek om ongeveer 02h20 arriveer  
het. A/o Marais, sers. Agenbach en ander lede van die Mag was teen-  
woordig.

Ek is verwittig, ek kan nie onthou deur wie nie, dat Aggett dood in sy  
sel aangetref is onder omstandighede soos hierbo omskryf.

Nadat ek my vergewis het dat Aggett reeds dood was het ek telefonies met  
die Distriksgeneesheer, Dr. NEILSON en die Staatspatoloog Prof.  
Scheepers in verbinding getree en hulle van die voorval verwittig.  
Nadat ek deur Prof. Scheepers meegedeel is dat ek so kan doen het ek  
die liggaam laat lossny en na die Staats-lykshuis laat verwyder.
