QUESTION A.

What was the name of the kraal which was burnt down by the Zulu army?

MADLOLO. This kraal is on the other side of the Mbuluzi River in MALANDELA area.

QUESTION B.

Who, of your people was first given this place by the king?

My great grandfather MFUNZA, who begot LANGA. Langa begot MMEMEZI and he begot SIFO (current).



QUESTION C.

Who was MFUNZA's father?

It was prince MALEKI, Somhlolo's brother.

QUESTION D.

Was this place given to MALEKI or MFUNZA?

It was MFUNZA.

QUESTION E.

At that time where was Maleki, and was he in charge of any place then?

He was still in the South at the royal kraal, and had not been given any place.

QUESTION F.

Was MFUNZA a popular man? How?

Somhlolo called him brother.

QUESTION G.

Were there any other GININDZA who were popular, or played certain roles for the king?

There was only MFUNDZA.
