The resignation of Prof. Matthews and Ir. Moroka from the N.R.C. stormed directly from the adoption by the ANC of the Programm of Action of 1969 which called specifically for the boyout of that body.

Dr. Xuma was not ousted from office according to any preparationed plan.

It was only at Conference in Hlosmfontein in 1949 when he rejected the
Programme outright, that the T.L. decided to replace him with sembody
commanding sufficient respect and prepared to be tied down to the programme.

All Dr. Ruma's colleagues refused to stand against him. The "Old Guard" was
loyal to Dr. Ruma.

Fortunately for the IL, Dr. Moreka had that aftermoon resigned from the ill-African Convention which was also necting in Bloomfortein and had the same day joined the A.N.O. He was willing to accept the Freedesay on the IL's conditions. The IL put him up as a candidate. He was not a politician, And his working conditions in Johannesburg run the organization as though he did not exist. He was garlanded and made much of. But he took no decisions. He was politically makes.

When, as a result of the Defiance Campaign, he and other leaders were arrested, they decided to defend themselves. Moreon's prestige was high. The presiding judge or megistrate at one stage asked him to address the crowds outside and ask them to be quiet and orderly. They evered him.

But the success of the campaign had unforseem results. First of all, the calling-off of the campaign because of the harsh penalties provided by the Criminal law Amendment Act, taken tegether with the fact that the mass of the people had served their prison terms undefended, lay the AND leaders open to the charge of covardice. The blame was shifted to Horeka. He was made the scapegoat. And a campaign of designation (7) was set afoot, which resulted in his being defeated by Luthuli in the elections of the following year. At the time, Luthuli's surrender of the Chieftsinship in reply to an ultimatum from Dr. Election (6), Sec. for Mative Affairs, had raised his stooks.

Secondly, the enthusiastic response of the African people to the compaign brought back the Old Reds and led to the formation of the Congress of Descorate - a "front" organisation.
