According to Simon, Virago rejected it because it was 'too laaking in commerciality.' Nicholas Perrin at John Murray wrote that he very much enjoyed reading it, found it moving and intimate - but didn't think they could sell enough.

I believe it was also rejected by Bloomsbury, and there may have been others. So you see this will not be an easy book to place, but whether you wish to try is up to you.
