The Gen. Secty (actg.) reported that Mr. Jas Ngcobo had handled correspondence ex. P. M. Bweg. Branch of solicitor, Mr. D'Alton, who therein asked for a guarantee in connection with a defended case by him now pending, a case of the P. M. Bweg I. C. M. Club.

The letter was considered & replied to.

next the A. G. Secty reported on the Hall downstairs as for this a licence was sought but failed;

that he consulted the Landlord for cancellation of its lease & further for a reduction of rents for the whole of the premises on behalf of the G. Body. "The landlord has agreed to the reduction, and this stands at £30.00" he said. The G. Body thanked him & endorsed his activity in this avenue.

Reporting that members of the ex-com. of the Dbr. Branch had called upon him for the keys of the safe claiming to have been deputized by the branch; the A. G. Secty stated that owing to certain remarks by these ^{men} he asked them to prove their demand and they were pointless and retired. The house put in that it was clear to the members that there is an ulterior motive by some person who seeks the position held by the Actg. G. Secty, and an intention to mislead the ranks and file is the worst by which this person seeks to bamboozle the members. But, that being a case detrimental to the interests of the organisation, this house remains firm on the terms of management as laid down in the constitution, and its arrangements.

The A. G. Secty further brought to the notice of the G. Body the actions of Com. Jas Ngcobo in connection with the care
