A Jbg non-White newspaper yy re\_rted tt a former leader of t now-outlawed Pan-Africanist Congres died in jail on May 31 -and tt his relatives only learned of his death two weeks later.

According to t newspaper, t relatives intend making an application in t and Supreme Court this week for t exhumation of t body. They want to re-affirm t cause of death, and want t body buried in Orlando.

T man, Mr G. Z. Siwisa, t former chairman of t Witwatersrand region of t PAC, ws serving a three-year sentence for incitment at t Cinderella Prison, Boksburg.

T newspaper states tt Mr Siwisa died on May 31, and ws buried t next day. T death certificate gives brain thrombosis as t cause of death. He ws buried by t prison authroities at Wattville Cemetery, Benoni.

Two weeks later, Mr Siwisa's daughter in Trlando East received a letter from t Bantu Commissioner's office in Jbg.

Addressed to "T relatives of t late George Siwisa", it we her first news of her father's death. T letter asked her to collect his clothes.

Mr Siwisa's daughter interviewed t superintendent of Boksburg'
Prison, who showed her t letter sent wax went to her advising her
of her father's death. But t letter hd not been delivered because

T correct address, according to t newspaper, ws in Mr Siwisa's prison file.

Mr Siwisa's daughter has told t newspaper tt she is worried about

these t matter. "We can't understand how they cd have buried him

t day after his death when, even if t letter had reached us, it wd have been
a day or two after his burial," she says.

She also cannot understand how, several weeks later, her correct address ws found.

She also wants to know why her father ws buried in thitie cemetery at Benoni. He died in Boksburg, and she says she has discovered tt prisoners are usually buried in special prison cemeteries

FOOTNOTE: On Friday, t RDM, twim acting on information received, asked t Fretoria headquarters of t Commissioner of Prisons for a statement on t death of Mr Siwisa. A senior official sd tt he had "no information at all" on t matter.

After t publication of yy's report in t non-White newspaper, t RDM again contacted t official. He repeated tt he hd no information about t matter. He promised to investigated it.
