Dear Russ

Just received your letter this morning. It is true that I said Mr. Palatone should be the treasurer of all. The morning I did that to protect you also because I knew the people of Bloomington if they knew that you were in charge of the matter and money they would keep us telling you to wait. So I told him that he must tell all the people that he was the treasurer also that he must personally hand over the money to Mr. Fitzmaurice so that he must not say that he gave the money to some one else. I do not see what is the reason which troubles you in that. You people some time through misunderstanding you must write had words unnecessarily. If you wanted our photo you should have told me accordingly. Do not speak like a child to me James.

You know it well that I trust you
and I proved it to you conclusively when
I was aware there that I trusted you above that
many people. That's the reason why you are
in that office today. I do not want people
to come to you and say "I want a photo negative
I will pay you tomorrow" You know I have lost
a big sum of money about those photos. Now
again on 17-6 they came out of my own pocket -
I know another man I should have hidden away
because no one could arrest me for that.
I want to keep my name clean where ever
I am known. I shall be glad if you will assist
Mr. Dalton. If all goes well I shall be there
at Blackfort on the 31st Dec. personally
Tell other friends also. If you can pay for the
photo on the 1st Jan 1906 that will be good enough
You know those people who are in the photo are not
reliable at all. Best regards to you all. You know.

He is getting married to a white girl
I was not coming over there. I had to be
going to his wedding.

Best regards to all Comrades and to
the lady Miss Price. The million dollar
girl.

Once more I say all photos that will not be
brought must be brought here but I shall
destroy them all personally as no one will
buy them here. These people of Glasgow
played me a dirty game.
