But I know that on the 13th May, he was informed that the Minister of the Interior had refused to have him issued with a lass boot. lassport. He applies immediately for an exit permit, Making that he had already booked a seat for the 18th Aurly in fune he received the forms for an Azir Pernix together with a covering letter requesting him to produce documentary Evidence to

the effect that he has been granked permenent residence in the M.S.A. and another forem the Minister of Justice to the effect that he was no longer restricted to Kimberley. In the stature he sent the forms off to the Secretary of the Anterior and a letter to the Minister of Justice asking for the necessary downent He has received no reply from the Minister of Justice yet. And in any livent, it is too late new for him to leave on the 18th as the document has to be forwarded to the Department of the Interior and Abe the forms sent back to my Thusband again . Where matters stande at the the moment.

I have myself appliest for an exist permit and have been sold to forward a document stating that the U.S.A. are prepared to grant me permanent residence. I wish you rould help me there.
