> INSPECTION IN TERMS OF SECTION 30(5) OF THE FUND-RAISING ACT, 1978 (ACT 107 OF 1978): END CONSCRIPTION COMMITTEE/CAMPAIGN (ECC)

INSPECTION 1.

The affairs of the abovenamed organisation were investigated on 5 February 1987.

ADDRESS 2.

The organisation does not occupy official offices at this stage and the inspection was done at the office of Mr P. Harris, their legal adviser. The address thereof is Cheadle, Thompson and Hayson, Denhill House, Jorissen Street, Johannesburg.

3. MANAGEMENT

In terms of the constitution of the organisation, that operates country-wide, there shall be regional committees, of whom there are nine at this stage, and a national committee. The national committee shall consist of one representative from each regional committee, normally the chairman of the regional committee.

During the inspection discussions were held with Mr S.B. Lowry, the national treasurer of the organisation, and Mr P. Harris their legal adviser. Mr Lowry was able to provide the following names of persons on the national committee -

Johannesburg region - C. Verbeek

Pietermaritzburg " - C. Oosthuizen

Durban " - R. Steele

Port Elizabeth " - J. Cherry

Cape Town " - P. Hathorne

The names of the members representing the Pretoria-, Grahamstown-, Stellenbosch- and East London regions were not available.

4. ADMINISTRATION

According to Mr Lowry the regional committees and the national committee have their own bank accounts. However, it is only the national committee that receives contributions, which then allocates amounts to the regional committees.

5. AIMS AND OBJECTIVES

The object of the ECC is to campaign and organise around the demand for an end to conscription into the South African Defence Force. The constitution of the ECC is attached - Schedule Al

6. BANK ACCOUNT

The organisation has a current account, No. 002125102 at Standard Bank, Hillbrow Branch, Johannesburg.
