#### DENMARK

A meeting of leading members of the Democratic League of Danish Women and several personalities, among them Mrs. Bodil Grase and Grete Sundby, who had been guests at the W.I.D.F. C uncil in Geneva, was held on March 14th to discuss preparation for the World Congress of Mothers.

At this meeting a press committee was set up which will suggest what kind of material should be sent to the press all over the country. The committee will select news from the material issued by the W.I.D.F. concerning arrangements for the Congress going on throughout the world and receive news from Danish factories, organisations, groups of women, wherever preparatory work is going on. It will see that this material is distributed for articles and news aragraphs. Commencing in April, the magazine of the Democratic League of Danish Women will publish news on progress in every number and one entire issue will be devoted to the World Congress f Mothers. The Appeal for the Congress will be printed in 100,000 copies, leaving a blank space for women and mothers to write their demands and desires in regard to peace and the World Congress of Mothers. These will then be sent to the National Preparatory Committee in Denmark.

## GERMAN DEMOCRATIC REPUBLIC

In the course of the 'Week of the German Women against Militarism and War, for Peace and Friendship between the Peoples', which was held at the beginning of March 1955, and during the celebration of International Women's Day, the members of the Democratic Union of German Women sold among the population of the German Democratic Republic 2,500,000 little bouquets of spring flowers, 100,000 postcards on the equality of women in the German Democratic Republic and 50,000 brooches bearing a picture of Clara Zetkin. The money thus raised will be used for financing the World Congress of Mothers.

In Altenburg 230 women workers have pledged themselves to buy every month a special solidarity stamp of the Federation of Free German Trade Unions to support the peace fighters in West Germany and enable women and mothers of West Germany to take part in the World Congress of Mothers.
