# How Communist Party Operates.

15/10



HE ASSISTED ME WITH THE POSTING OF THE FIRST BATCH OF PAMPHLETS IN AUGUST 1971. WITH SALIM I ONLY HAD MARXIST POLITICAL DISCUSSIONS. HE WAS NOT AWARE OF THE PAMPHLETS IN THE CAR WHEN WE WERE ARRESTED ON 22/10/1971.



According to my knowledge there is close co-operation between the Communist Party of South Africa and the African National Congress. Every South African who goes abroad is a potential recruit to the ranks of the African National Congress and the Communist Party irrespective of his race and colour. I joined the Party because of my stay in London at my relatives place - Mr. Essip Gubrad also and during 1969 I had developed a firm friendship with Stephen Kemp who was a member of the Central Committee of the Communist Party of South Africa.

ANC Regarding the Radio Petang, Radio Moscow and Radio Tanzania broadcasts - the latter was advertised in one of the pamphlets of the ANC distributed in the country.

The pamphlets are printed in England. To my knowledge the record distributed was also made in some studio in London.

At two year meetings of the ANC youth branch which I attended in 1968 (around March and June) the slogan AMANDA NGEWETIU was shouted - this slogan in essence is tantamount to that of an attack.

I was given the sum of Five Hundred Rand by Jack Hodgson prior to my departure for South Africa to purchase to use the money for the purchase of <sup>printing</sup> machinery and stationery for distribution purposes. I, however, did not buy any printing machinery but used the school's duplicating machine for the cyclostyle of 'INKULLLEKO'. The draft copy of the newsletter was sent to me by post and I thereafter had to print the necessary stencils - as the size of the stencil was to be of a uniform nature. And it was typed by me with my own UNDERWOOD PORTABLE T/Writer with a red



cover, this machine has been taken into possession by the Police.

DISTRIBUTION OF PAMPHLETS BY ME.

The first occasion was in June/July in August 1970. The posting on this occasion was done by me and Salem Essip <sup>from the</sup> Jeppe Street Post Office after 8pm. About 400 to 500 were posted by us simultaneously. Soon after the distribution comments of the distribution were being heard and also advertised by the daily papers. I think ARC <sup>(C-1)</sup> headquarters in London sent me a letter of congratulations through Jack Hodgson. The addresses on the first

occasion was typed out by Kalyani Chethia and was typed onto the envelopes using my typewriter. I paid her Rs. 3.00 for her work. She was given the envelopes and was not told for what purposes they were for. The list of the envelope names was sent in the same packet containing the envelopes. The pamphlets were on the occasion sent <sup>inside</sup> ~~under~~ a box containing Darjeeling <sup>to P.O. Box 446, Kalyani, not in my name.</sup> ~~tea~~. Around 1,000 pamphlets were sent in the box.

After having received the printed envelopes I then personally put them into the envelopes, bought the stamps and posted about 500 together with the assistance of Salem Essip. (Salem Essip only assisted in posting).

The second occasion when I received pamphlets through my father's post-box <sup>446, Kalyani</sup> was in the early part of 1971. This time the pamphlets were concealed under a box of circles and there were about 500 <sup>to P.O. Box 446, Kalyani, not in my name.</sup>. I personally printed ~~these~~ <sup>these</sup> one and posted these also from Jeppe Post Office after 8pm.

The third occasion I received a draft copy of 'INKULULEKO' and was directed to Cyclostyle

 duplicated these one afternoon in late July at  
 using the school's duplicating machine.  
 The envelopes were given <sup>by me to be</sup> addressed to Miss  
Ayesha Bulbulia of Cape's Commercial College who was  
 completely not aware of what was to be placed  
 inside the envelope. She typed some 300 to  
 400 addresses from the address list found with  
 the Pocket. This time two different size  
 brown envelopes were used and I paid her  
 for about R3 for her work. The placing of the  
 newspapers <sup>inside the envelopes</sup> was done by me at home in the  
 night and posted by me from Jappe Street  
 Post Office at night. The <sup>initial</sup> distribution  
 of the paper was to come out by the  
 end of July 1971 thus marking <sup>the</sup> 50th Anniversary  
 of the birth of the Communist Party of South  
 Africa. And I think some were posted by  
 me from Roodfontein.

The first & second batch of leaflets  
 were titled as: Sons & Daughters of Africa  
 and What the ANC Says to Parake  
 and his gang.

The final one was under the following heading: -

INKULULEKO

Official Organ of the Communist Party of S. Africa.

Jordan Moodley

I came to know the above person through  
 my Cousin Bahija Desai who had asked to  
 give his phone number of his place of work. I phoned  
 Jordan on some time after July 1970 and arranged  
 to meet him at the Corner of Bickers and Market  
 Streets in Johannesburg. There after I met him



for a few times at his place in Long where we had general discussions on politics. At one of these meetings I had showed him the draft guidelines of the organizational structure of the Party with its main and sub groups operating internally within the country. Soon after this he was to leave JHB. and in the new year was to settle in Durban. During I recommended his name to HQ/quarters and the latter approved. But I did not inform him of my recommendation to the HQ/quarters but took this initiative upon myself. During my visit/holiday to Durban in the first two weeks of January I contacted Indres by phone and arranged to meet him at his place. I went down to Indres' place and had a general talk with him (and offered to give him and Jack Cooper, (Indres' friend) a lift for the day when I was also leaving for home. I had also given him on one of these occasions two books on Marxism - namely

What is Marxism and Marxism versus Post-Marxist Philosophy.

Also when I was in Durban I had also given to Indres through my friend Yaqoob Parachias, (some friend of mine) flat number in the Centre of Durban where he could contact on a social basis.

By about April I had not heard from him and decided to write to his wife implying very clearly in the letter that he should contact me and why has he not done so. I did not receive a reply from Indres to this letter and did not again hear from him.

The above person comes also from the same town as I do - Roodepoort, thus I know him and his family well, this relationship has always been a non-political creature with him. During my holiday in Durban I visited



Yakub three to four times purely on a social basis. He studied at the Textile Engineering College in Leicester during the period 1967 - 1969. and returned to South Africa soon ~~immediately~~ thereafter. He is at present an engineer of textile machinery machines in his father's factory - Draheen Hoising Mfg. Co. - Durban.

Soon after I arrived from London and in my first despatches to my Contact Stephen I mentioned some names and referred to them as prospective candidates for the Party. Here I must emphasise that ~~not~~ all the names were written without any <sup>proper</sup> prior political discussion or ~~journalings~~ <sup>with any of them</sup> ~~but~~ <sup>being</sup> ~~written~~ <sup>written</sup> ~~down~~ <sup>down</sup> for the sake of ~~writing~~ <sup>writing</sup> ~~down~~ <sup>down</sup> most of their political leanings I was not aware of but wrote their names down because I had known them in the past (or come to know them through a third person, e.g. Kamina Wadwa) persons such as: Hassan Jomra I had known him at College in 1961 to 1963 but had met him once only after I had come back from London. He has to the best of my knowledge or had no connections whatsoever with the Communist Party ~~to~~ <sup>internally</sup> and externally. The same can be said of the following persons:-




