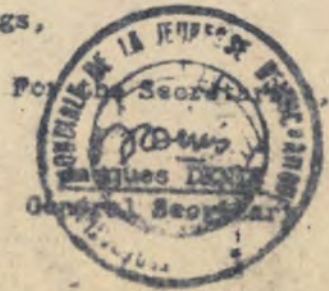
We are confident that next year you will celebrate February 21st with the youth of all the world on an even greater scale. The W.F.D.Y. will do everything possible to make your celebration a success.
