A message was given to me by the Officials of the Bantu Social Centre in connection with the meeting that was held last night. I read your message to the meeting as it was written on a piece of paper.

I believe you have seen our resolution as published in this morning's paper.

I do not know how far this matter will go but we intend to press forward with our claim for some consideration by the employers of labour.

I pointed out to you in my last letter that I intend going on with my work irrespective of whether I failed in the polls. I know that I am working under great difficulties. I was therefore pleased to receive your letter.

I had sent a notice to Dr J. L. Dube who attended the meeting and was also elected to be one of the members of the delegation to handle this matter.

I belong to the Union that is misunderstood by the Department of Native Affairs. All genuine efforts emanating from us is being looked upon with a certain amount of mistrust.

I shall be much thankful if you will continue to show us the spirit contained in your message.
