5 Father Superior & Sr. M.M. went to Untaka to a meeting of the Diocesan Medical Board in Hospital car. Tea party in parlour to which practically all the Europeans came, to say good-bye to Dr. Irving.
6 Dr. Irving & all her luggage to Queenstown by car; Sr. M.M. driving & Sr. J. H. accompanying her. The two latter stayed the night with the C.R. Sisters at St. Monica's Home.

20 Advent Corporate Retreat - un-conducted. Sr. Mary Pauline from Bloemfontein, came to-day for her retreat. Heavy rain. Usual preparation. Sr. M. A. responsible for the crib this year. Midnight Mass, began at 11.45 p.m. with

Blessing of the Crib. The Father Superior was the Celebrant. M^r. Stanbrook (who is here ^{for his holiday} from the Theological College, G' Town) served, assisted by two Africans.

Christmas Day. Services as usual. A happy Mission tea, party in our Refectory in the afternoon. African Xmas. tree in S.S.'s office - taller than before.

28 Sister Emily Isobel from St. Mary's School, Waterley, Jo'burg, & Sister Joan from St. Mary's, Pretoria arrived for their rests. They came on the speeded-up express bus which now reaches Tsoho at mid-day. They were met by Sr. D. & Sr. M. M.

31 Dr. Dickson & Sr. M. M. motored to Butterworth to a meeting of the Association of Medical Missions of the Transkei & Ciskei. A hot day. Visitors pic-niced.

1947.

JANUARY 1st Solemn Vespers.

2nd C.S.J.B. Chapter Sisters to tea at 3.30 p.m. Carols in Chapel, tea in Refectory - Games in community room or on slope - "Prizes" from Xmas tree. Thereafter we had an address in Chapel from Father Young.

3 Much-needed rain ^{car}. Devotions.

4 Up the Kypsenkaby with the visitors, for the view which was very lovely. Got some attractive wild flowers

January 4 on the return journey.

5. 2nd Sunday. The Bishop, who has come for the Final Vows of Sr. Datini, came after Mass. To visit us at 7.30 p.m. Chatted to whole family for some time.
- Epiphany Final Vows of Sr. Datini C.S.J.B. in their Chapel. The Bishop preached, & celebrated. Sr. M. M. to tea at S. J.B. in p.m.
- 7 Visitors went pic-nic to "Caves" in a.m. taking lunch & sketching apparatus. Very hot & thunderous, so returned early in afternoon. (Carver returns to Bloemfontein to-day.) Pic-nic lunch near Tollgate with Sr. Mary Pauline visiting Sister in hospital.
- 9 C.S.J.B. Chapter meeting at 6 p.m. Sr. M. M. attended, Sr. F. A. altho' she had no role.
- 13 Father Huddleston C.R. who has come to take our Annual Retreat, arrived by car to-day, & came down to talk about arrangements.
- 14 Retreat began after supper, in the absence of the conductor! He had gone by car to Germfane for fishing, caught in thunderstorm, streams rose, car nearly washed away with all occupants. Spent night at Seixago where they received much kindness.
- 15 Father Young went out in mission car, & fetched back the visitors who had been storm stayed. They seemed none the worse, & Fr. Huddleston gave the address in the afternoon.

11. Sister Hilda Verity to East London where she is to stay with the C.R. Sisters for her rest. She went by the new bus, which leaves Umfala Station 6 a.m., & reaches E. London 12.20 p.m. Fare 27/- Sr: M. M. took her in by car, leaving here at 4.40 a.m. St: Mary's Hostel meeting in afternoon.
12. St: Lucy's Committee (Special) meeting to discuss the financial situation, at 11 a.m.

15. Sr: J. in Retreat.

17. Sr: K. A. ..

Shrovetide 18. Sr: W. L. .. Father Leary (recently Archdeacon) who is coming to stay at the Mission House for Lent, to write his reminiscences, arrived to-day.

Ash Wednesday 19th: Imposition of Ashes & Mass in our Chapel at 6.20 (the Father Superior). Sr: Euphemia in Retreat.

20. Sr: M. M. in Retreat.

Lent 1 23. Father Leary is giving the addresses on Sunday a.m.'s in Lent. He brought his dog down to hospital at mid-day - he found it lying out on the field badly assaulted. It died in the evening.

S. Matthias 24. Sister Deneve had anaesthetic so have braces opened (in face) thereafter in bed.

- February 25 Hail storm - very noisy, but no glass broken. Miss Drew in bed.
27 Address from Father Young. Hotel meeting to discuss Royal Visit.
28 Sat. M. & Mr. went to see Mangala who is dying of T.B. in his kraal at Tajveri. Seemed v. weak, but pleased to be visited.

- dent II 2 Miss Caine to tea. Sr. M. on a call with Miss Drew, got back late for tea.
5 Royal Family in Umtata. Conveyances left the Mission from 5 a.m. onwards, St. Mary's girls who did not go (16) had a pic-nic by the river. Busters had a pic-nic lunch under the longat tree. Dr. Jackson & Miss Drew were in the hospital car. A lovely day, & all had a happy time.
6 A downpour of rain.

- Holy Saturday Usual arrangements - Sext & None at mid-day. Sr. M. A.,
responsible for Easter Garden in Childrens' Chapel.
- Ceremony of Holy Fire at 3 p.m. Father Superior brought
the Blessed Sacrament from the Tabernacle in church to
the Altar in the Childrens' Chapel where it remained
during the Blessing of the New Fire - then it was fetched
to our Chapel after which Vespers was sung. Sr. W. L. had
made a very fine Paschal Candle.
- Easter Day English Mass at 6 a.m. in church. Sung at 8.30.
The church was very full - a lovely sunny day.
- Easter Monday Boarders went pic-nic to the dam; also most
Sisters. Sr. D. did a very pleasing sketch.
- April 9 Meeting of Diocesan Board of Medical Missions in
Umtata at 10 a.m. Father Superior, Dr. Dickson &
Sr. M. M. attended this - going in hospital car. Mr. Bryn
& Rosemary also went to see Mr. Robson (Mr. Webster)

1947.

- April 9 who is in Umtala Hospital; also Dr. Kuphemia for shopping.
Got back here at 2 p.m. except Dr. Dickson who has gone to Mlaza with Dr. Nye for a few days. Sr. Joan Augustine has come for her rest, Miss Drene fetched her from Tsolo in her car.
- 10 Heard to-day that Fr. Young is going on furlough & expects to sail about May 11th. Sr. J. A. had tea (a.m.) with Sr. M. M. Suddenly cold, & windy. Miss Drene went into Umtala to dentist, & took Miss Roberts (Sr. Faith's cousin) who has been on a visit here, & is now going to the Free State.
- 12 Call to Ggapala - Sr. J. A. went for drive - also Branby, & Sr. M. M. driving. Ambulance broke down 7 times! Mr. Atkins of Tencu eventually rendered first aid at Wongwale, after which the remainder of the journey was accomplished without further mishap.

1st Sunday Took man with fractured leg to Umtala Hospital. Brought after Easter back Dr. Dickson who has been at Mlaza for a few days. Sr. J. A. & Sr. M. M. had pic-nic tea.

11. Sr. Dorothy Helen is going to Kira Magwaya, Bulawayo, for her rest. Took her to bus in Tsolo to en route for Kokstad.

15 Sr. J. A.'s birthday. Had p.m. birthday tea, in S.S.'s office, with diminutive cake.

16 The Reverend Mother C.S.M.s.A.A. (Blomfonsein) came to-day. She is having her rest here. Fetched her from Tsolo by car.

19 Sr. J. in Retreat; but had violent tooth-ache, so Dr. Dickson informed her to Umtala (also Sr. J. A. fit drive) she returned with her 3 remaining upper teeth missing!

2nd Sunday Miss Muriel Drene to tea. Dr. Dickson not feeling after Easter well, so went to bed early.

Bank 21st Princess Elizabeth's coming-of-age. Some Sisters climbed Holiday. Kwanza with some of boarders, & had lovely pic-nic on top. Residue had pic-nic on lawn! The Passion Play was repeated at St. Joseph's. Very beautifully done & very impressive. Dr. Dickson in bed.

1947.

- April 25 Sr: Evelyn Angela to Mbokotswana by bus carrier to Tsolo St. Mark. To on foot from there. She is to stay for the week-end. Call to ~~the~~ Hopedale. Took Sr: J.A. in ambulance, & fetched in v. ill patient. Dr: D. up for dinner & tea. Sang Kepers.
- 26th Sr: Euphemia organised a party to go to Mbokotswana in Mr Dressel's car. Mother Bloemfontein, Sr: J.A. & 2 others, never reached there; but had a grand pic-nic! Evidently took the wrong turning, got on to bad ground, & threatening thunder scared them. Sr: M.A. in Retreat.
- 29th Sung Mass in our Chapel as Fr: Young leaves on furlough to-day. Two boys served. Lovely Mass - on household, Wally, & Mary Caine. Dr: D. Sr: J.A. & self to meeting of Transkei & Ciskei Medical Assocn. at Butterworth left there 7.30 a.m. had a.m. tea en route. Lovely day but windy. Pic-nic lunch after meeting. Did some shopping in Umtata on return journey.
- 30 Took Mother Bloemfontein to Tsolo for Umtata bus. Also Sr: Euphemia & Sr: J.A. We met Freddie in Tsolo, who decided to return here. Took her in car to Lolana - pic-nic lunch on way - cup of tea at Lolana, much chat.
