Township Catechism Play was acted in Chapel at 3.0. Very successful. S.A.B. to bed early on account of the rheumatism.

who was to take a 1/2 day Retreat

The Van went into town to fetch palm. S. A.R. S. Sued & ~~S. T.~~ went on it to shop, see Dr. Sanders the dentist. S. E. T. also went to shop.

His brother & Miss Joan brightman called after tea, the latter promised to come & help the work of the Home during April.

S. E. T. took Mother to the D.S.G. at 6.0c. To make up his bed she had missed. They returned about 9.30 p.m.
