November 11th. No Mass in Chapel. Everyone went to St. Martin's for Mass at 7 a.m. as it was St. Martin's Day & the Chaplain had to go on & take the Mass at the School. Sister Endea & Sister Alma left. The news of the Assistant was fairly good.
- Min (Carew) Hunt & Father Huddleston came on the 6-4 p.m. train. Evening & Sermon 6-15 p.m.
- Monday.
November 12th. Mass 7-15. Requiem. The Chaplain. Mass 8 a.m. Father Huddleston c.h. Busy all day preparing for the Sophia Town, Orlando, & Trumelby Staff Retreat. All arrived by 6 p.m. News about the Assistant fair; in the evening her temp: was up & much pain in the joints.

November 13th. Mass 7-15. Fr. Huddleston. Fine all day, but quite a cold morning. Sister Gladys Austin went on the Van in the afternoon to see the Assistant. The latter improving but progress slow. Min Clisby came in the morning to give the Retreat.

November 14th. Mass, Requiem. 7-15. Fr. Huddleston. Mother went to see the Assistant who was really very ill. Both Min Baker & 1st Lang said Sister was very ill. Sister Endea rang up in the evening & said she had been to see the Assistant in the afternoon & she had decidedly improved & they were going to give her percollin injections. Temp: 102 in the evening. A swarm

of bees in a tree out side the Cottage! the Station Master came to take it at 5 p.m. All the lights went out before Swansong, Horn had to be fetched. All on again by 8 p.m.

Mass. 7-15. Fr. Huddleston c.s. Effie Elliot left after Morning Tea. After Vespers (2-15 p.m.) Mother & S^r K^r Elizabeth drove into Pretoria, Mother to see the Assistant & go on to the School to see S^r D. Tom. & Sister K. Elizabeth to shop. The Assistant much as usual; but having penicillin injections; temperature up & rash still there. Sister Christine returned in the car with Mother & S^r K^r. for Retreat.

Accounts of the Assistant rather disappointing with the temp: going up. Swansong at 10.30 p.m. Sun 7 a.m. 2 a.m. After Morning Tea, Mother had the Sisters about Christmas shopping & presents. After Vespers Mother drove into Pretoria to the Nursing Home to see the Assistant.

The temp: still high. Miss Warner came to stay; also M^r Kempel, Fr. Dauntion c.s. & Sister Olive Irene for Retreat. Swansong + Communion 6-15 p.m.

- Monday November 19th. Mass. 6:45 a.m. as the Chaplain took the Assistant her communion in the Nursing Home, Mother driving him in. Mrs Parry left. M^r Clark came.
Sister Emma, Sister K. Elizabeth, & S^r J. Augustine went to the School Native picnic down in the Irene Club field. The Assistant had a blood test taken, enteric was feared. Sister Olive Irene in Retreat.
- Tuesday. Mass 7-15. The Chaplain. A Mass at 8 a.m. Fr. Downton for St Edmund K.H. 11th Clark in Retreat also M^r Kengel. Heard November 20th from D^r Lang in the morning. The blood test had proved the Assistant had enteric. Sister Dorothy Joan came for two days in Retreat.
- Wednesday. Mass 7-15. Fr. Downton C.R. Mrs Tyrell, + Mrs Ingram came to stay. S^r J. Joan, S^r Angela, S^r N. Anne, + S^r Joan Augustine in Retreat. After Recreation Mother drove into Proctoria to see the Assistant but she was asleep. Miss Baker reported Sister was standing up to the enteric well; but she had it very badly so it would just run its course.
- S^r C. Austin took girls to N^r Harvey in the morning. Some rain during the afternoon.
- Thursday. Mass 7-15. The Chaplain. Also me at 8 a.m. Fr. Downton. Sister J. Joan, S^r K. Elizabeth, November 21st S^r V. Ruth + Sister B. Mary. in Retreat.
- News of the Assistant was satisfactory as could be expected. No complications + the thing running its usual course.
- Friday. Mass 7-15. Fr. Downton. C.R. Mother + S^r C. Austin for St Clement B.M. S^r B. Mary, + S^r J. Augustine went to Proctoria November 23rd in the Van. Mother went to see the Assistant Reports about her still satisfactory + no complications; but still a critical time.

M^r Kempel left in the afternoon. Classes as usual.

Saturday. Mass. - 15. The Chaplain. Mass 8 a.m. Father Donelan.

Fri 9. Thanksgiving. Fox & John of the Cross who left on the 10 a.m. train. After after noon

November 24th tea, Sister Gene, Sister K Elizabeth, Sister Violet Bratty, Sister Marjorie Anne, & M^r Haeder went on the 5-15 p.m. train to Princeton for a Play at the School & all returned in the School car with Sister Endora who came for the night. The news of the Assistant satisfactory but not out of the wood yet. Evening & Devotions 6-30 p.m.

Sunday Went home Sung Mass 7 a.m. The report about the Assistant Advent. letter, Miss Baker said there had been a decided improvement within the last 48 hours. Mother

(St Katharine of S.) went to see her in the afternoon & her temp: was normal & she seemed much more herself. Mother's installation day! 12 years!! lovely gifts from the School Sisters in Chapel; Flowers & other things from the Holy & Sisters. Mother had tea at the School after seeing the Assistant. Sister Editha came for Retreat. Evening & Devotions

Monday. Mass. 8-15. Recruit. Mother drove the Chaplain

November 26th into Princeton afterwards as he took the Assistant her communion. Her temperature was normal all day!. Mother in Retreat, Sister Editha, a Sister Mary Brigid in Retreat also. M^r Clark left.

Tuesday. No Mass. Sister Editha left on the 10 train.

November 27th After Recreation Mother drove into Princeton to see the Assistant & took Sister Gene with her. The Assistant really better & had had a normal temperature for two days! Sister Gladys Austin in Retreat.

Wednesday. Mass 7-15. Fr. Shelley came. M^r Soames turned up unexpectedly at 12 o'clock! stayed

for dinner & then left at 2 p.m. In the afternoon Sister Endora brought over Ruth Baker, Helen Wheeler, & M^r & Mrs. Bentz to see the Home, & Sister Joyce for Retreat. Girls Service 6-8 p.m.

The car had run up to Pretoria, Mother, S^r V.R., & S^r M.B. went in & S^r Joyce returned to the School. The Assistant's temperature up a little but only what was to be expected; the Normal temp: came too soon to last!!
Classes as usual.
- Mass 7-15. After Mass, M^r Sanders, & Miss Ingram had Holy Unction. Miss Ruth, a Rhodes Student came. The Assistant about the same; more cheerful but temp: down.
Evening & Devotions: 6-30 p.m.
- Mass. 7-15. Mother went to see the Assistant who seemed much worse herself; the temp: was down. Sister Benita left in the evening. Evening & Sermon 6-15
- Mass. 7-15. Sister Angela & Sister Endora went to Johannesburg for shopping; Mother also went in for the 2nd Meeting. A telegram from Sister Irene saying she was arriving on Tuesday!. Two men from the Health Department came to see about the flies.
- Mass. 7-15. Fr. Winter, c.n. Sister Irene arrived on the 9-30 a.m. train from India

+ Mother met her. After Recreation Mother + S. M. Anne went into Portera. Mother saw the Assistant who was really better + the doct - said Sister was going on nicely + her temperature had settled. News also received that two passages for Sister were offered in the Carnarvon Castle for December 23rd. Sister Edwina + Sister Barbara Mary to take them. The house + both Branch Houses were sprayed during the afternoon with DDT from the Public Health department. Not a fly to be seen anywhere!!.

to much. Fr. Thomas C. ^{Came} B. to conduct the
Advent Retreat. All the School Sisters
came for it 20 in Retreat! Miss Barth
left. Two sets of adoptive parents came
to see babies.

December 17th Mass 7-15. After Tece Mother drove into
Pretoria to see the Assistant. After None Mother
& S^r G Austin sorted the Christmas presents. Storm
& heavy rain at 4 p.m. Singing practice for
those who go to Mass. 6-45 p.m.
- Tuesday.
December 18th Mass 7-15. Petronella went to the General
Hospital with entire Fr. Jones came for Retreat.
M^m Jamison came to stay. S^r B. Mary went
in on the Van to see the Assistant.
- Wednesday.
Ember Day.
December 19th Mass 7-15. Fr. Shelly came for address &
confessions. Mother General returned from
Shuttlenu. At 12-15. Mother C. & Mother P.
drove into Pretoria to have lunch with
the Bishop & to see the Assistant.

Mother also went to see the Assistant + was told she had a slight perforation so her progress was retarded somewhat. Mother took the Assistant's Christmas things to the N. Home. Mother C. started on the crib. Singing practice 6-45 p.m. for non Plan girls no classes.
- Saturday. Mass 7-15. Miss Haeder retired with German measles!! Mrs Hole, + Miss Plaistre came, also Miss Fraser. Girls + Native Confessions Mornings afternoon. Mrs Owen John came + fetched Jean Maria. Evening + Devotions 6-30 p.m.
- Sunday. Sing Mass 7 a.m. At 9-15. Mother C. S^t K^e, S^t V R, + S^t B M. drove to the Cathedral for the Ordination of the two Native Deacons; afterwards they went to see the Assistant. Rest of the day taken up with preparations for Christmas. Several old girls came + Blanch Williams stayed the night. Sister Agnes Irene came to stay. Evening + Scrum 6-15 p.m.
- Monday. Mass 7-15. Preparing all day for the Festival Christmas Eve 5th + None 12. Dinner 12-30. Solemn Vespers, Vigil. Hymn, Procession, + Carol. 5-30 p.m. Mother December 24th G. did the Crib; very lovely. Mother C. much enjoyed the present giving after the Procession in Trust + then she went round to see the various decorations. Supper 7 p.m. Compline 8. Nocturns 11.
- Tuesday. No Mid Night Mass!. Mother P. was Christmas Day. fetched out of Nocturns to the December 25th telephone + Mrs Lanni was there saying the Chaplain had suddenly been taken
