REPORT OF THE BOARD OF MANAGEMENT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31st DECEMBER, 1940.

Report of the Members of the Board of Management, to be presented to Members at the Thirty-ninth Ordinary General Meeting, to be held in the Council Chamber of the Transvaal Chamber of Mines, on Monday, the 28th day of April, 1941, at 10 a.m.

Gentlemen,

We beg to submit our Report on the operations of the Association for the year ended 31st December, 1940, together with the Audited Accounts.

RECRUITING.

The following figures show the numbers of Natives obtained by the Association and its Members from all sources during 1940:—

During the year 1940, the Association obtained a total of 84,766 Natives. Of this number, 62,484 came from the Province of Moçambique, south of Latitude 22° South, and 22,282 from certain territories north of Latitude 22° South. The total number of Natives, viz., 383,927 received from all sources of supply during 1940 was 37,899 greater than the number received during 1939.

WASTAGE.

The usual statistical table (Annexure A), giving particulars of the number of Natives taking their discharge and the losses from deaths and desertions for the year 1940 as compared with previous years, is attached.

ACCOUNTS.

CAPITAL.

The Registered Capital of the Association remained unaltered throughout the year under review, viz., 59,800 shares of £1 each, of which 59,754 shares had been issued at the 31st December, 1940. The position of your Capital Account at that date was as follows:—

The Board, acting under Clause 15 of the Articles of Association, decided to make a refund of 11.68 per cent. on the capitation fees paid for Natives during 1940.

After providing for depreciation of assets and for items of special expenditure incurred in Tropical areas, the Appropriation Account for the development of the Association's organization in those areas stood, at the end of the year, at £75,235 14s. 2d.

To cover certain additional items of cost, the Association's capitation fee for a Native engaged for twelve months' service was increased from £3 10s. 0d. to £3 17s. 0d. as from 1st March, 1940.

The costs in connection with the Natives allotted by the Association, including all Head Office, Compound and Hospital Expenses, amounted to 2.94d. per contracted shift for 1940, as compared with 2.72d. for 1939.

In addition to the 84,766 Natives received at your three compounds, 115,844 contracted B.S.A. Natives were received at the Johannesburg Compound for medical examination and registration. Of these, 200,610 Natives, 749 East Coast, 1,957 Tropical, and 2,674 B.S.A. Natives, who were train-weary or otherwise unfit for immediate distribution were detained for recuperation and subsequent distribution.

550 East Coast, 98 Tropical, and 1,169 B.S.A. Natives, who failed to pass the examination of the mine medical officers, were returned to your compounds for further examination.

920 East Coast and 127,883 B.S.A. Natives who proceeded direct from their homes to the mines in search of employment, were received at the compounds for medical examination and registration.

7,674 time-expired East Coast Natives and 33,501 time-expired B.S.A. Natives presented themselves at the three compounds for further service on the mines.

2,853 East Coast, 614 Tropical and 7,367 B.S.A. Natives were received from the mines as medical rejects, which included 5,235 injured Natives and 2,687 Natives admitted under the Miners' Phthisis Act (No. 35 of 1925) for examination and assessment for compensation.

2,181 Natives engaged by contractors to the mines were received for medical examination.

55,637 time-expired East Coast Natives presented themselves at the three compounds for repatriation. A total of 1,249,883 such Natives have been repatriated under the aegis of the Association since 1906.

17,817 Tropical Natives, who were time-expired were repatriated during the year.

NATIVES IN TRANSIT.—46,854 East Coast recruits, en route from Ressano-Garcia to Johannesburg, were fed at the Witbank Compound, and 3,776 East Coast recruits, 121 East Coast repatriates, with 21,112 B.S.A. recruits and repatriates, were accommodated in the Breyten Compound in transit to and from the mines.

£227,872 5s. 3d. was deposited with the Association at Johannesburg and Witbank for safekeeping by Natives pending departure for their homes, as against £196,202 11s. 6d. in 1939.

RESSANO-GARCIA.—52,086 Natives for Mine work passed through the hands of your compound staff at Ressano-Garcia during the twelve months under review. Of this number, 169 were rejected either by the Association's Medical Officer or the Portuguese officials at that place, 13 deserted, 2 died, 815 were on hand at the end of the year, and the balance of 51,087 came forward. 51,599 Natives repatriated under the aegis of the Association were also dealt with at Ressano-Garcia prior to leaving for their kraals.

ZOEKMAKAAR.—7,965 Natives were examined, of whom 7,157 were received at Johannesburg for Mine work. 5,966 Native repatriates were handled by your staff at Zoekmakaar during the year.

STEGI.—3,778 Natives were sent forward for mining employment, of whom 15 deserted *en route* to Johannesburg, and 120 East Coast Natives passed through the depot *en route* home.

WEI-HAI-WEI (China).—This property remains unsold.

All compounds have been maintained in a thorough state of repair.

HEALTH OF NATIVES.

The Report of your Chief Medical Officer (Dr. A. I. Girdwood) is attached. The death-rate during the years 1940 and 1939 among Native labourers employed by Members of the Association was as follows:—

The above figures are based on deaths occurring on the Mines, and do not include deaths occurring among recruits and repatriates in the Association's Johannesburg, Modderbee, Witbank, Breyten, and Zoekmakaar Compounds. These latter number 147 (vide Annexure G) and, if included, the death-rate from disease only for 1940 is increased to 3.44 per thousand per annum, as compared with 3.68 for 1939.

The welfare of Natives in Mine Compounds received the earnest attention of the Transvaal Mine Medical Officers' Association, the Health Advisory Committee, and the Compound Managers' Association throughout the year.

PAYMENT OF ACCIDENT COMPENSATION TO MINE NATIVES.

The Central Medical Boards established at Johannesburg and Witbank to determine the degree of incapacitation sustained by Natives through Mine accidents, examined 5,235 Native cases during the year. 5,121 Natives were awarded and paid on behalf of members compensation amounting to £41,714 6s. 3d.

In addition to the foregoing amounts, £11,052 15s. 4d. compensation moneys due in the estates of deceased Natives were paid to the Director of Native Labour for administration.

TROPICAL AREAS ADMINISTRATION.

The extension of the Association's organisation in Tropical areas has been steadily pushed forward during the year.

Northern Bechuanaland.—In Northern Bechuanaland the large receiving and entraining depot at Francistown is complete, and the 600-mile Kalahari road system, running from Francistown through Nata to Kazungula and to Maun and Mohembo, is nearing completion. An 8 ft. high concrete bridge, 500 ft. in length, is being constructed over the Nata River. The motor transport fleet is now centralised at Francistown, and a regular twice-weekly service is in force, connecting with a twice-weekly entrainment to and from Johannesburg.

Barotseland.—The Association commenced the medical examination and engagement of Natives in Barotseland on 1st November, 1940; the Zambesi route from Mongu and Kalabo to Kazungula being opened at the same time.

This route comprises three sections, namely:—Kazungula-Katima Mulilo, 110 miles water transport by motor barge; Katima Mulilo-Nangweshi—along the Association's road—120 miles by motor lorry; and Nangweshi-Mongu, 110 miles water transport by motor barge. (Pending delivery of barges, this last section is still traversed on foot.)

The first section was made practicable by the discovery of a deep channel (termed the "Kasaya Channel")—across the Caprivi Strip and connecting the Zambesi and Chobe rivers—which avoids the rapids at Mambova, North of Kazungula. The Caprivi Strip Administration has permitted the Association to make a five-mile road from Katima Mulilo southward to avoid the Katima Mulilo rapids; and the landing point for the barges is below those rapids. The route then proceeds in Northern Rhodesia on high ground along the Zambesi for 110 miles to Nangweshi. Sites have been leased from the Barotse Native Authority and bush camps built at Katima Mulilo and Nangweshi.

The installation by the Association of wireless transmitting stations at Mongu and Kalabo similar to those in Northern Bechuanaland has been agreed to by the Northern Rhodesia Government. It will be some time before the apparatus is available.

Nyasaland.—At the request of the Nyasaland Government the Association, in May, suspended its recruiting operations in Nyasaland so as not to compete with the recruiting, by the Government, of Askari for the King's African Rifles. In September the Association's organisation was placed at the disposal of the Government to assist in such recruitment. This position still prevailed at the end of the year.

The number of tropical Natives employed on the Gold Mines at 31st December, 1940, was 22,314, as compared with 19,260 at 31st December, 1939. The death rate for the year 1940 from all diseases amongst tropical Natives employed on the Mines was 6·15 per 1,000 per annum as compared with 5·27 in 1939.

Headquarters.—In view of the expansion of operations in tropical areas, the headquarters of your Tropical Areas Administration have been transferred from Johannesburg to Salisbury, where Mr. W. Gemmill directs the administration as General Manager.

MOÇAMBIQUE CONVENTION OF 1928.

An agreement was concluded in May, 1940, between the Union and Portuguese Governments under which the maximum number of Portuguese Natives permitted to be employed by the Gold Mines and Collieries (members of the W.N.L.A.) in terms of the Convention was, subject to certain conditions, increased from 80,000 to 100,000; the increase to remain effective during the currency of the renewed Convention, viz., five years from 21st April, 1939, and at twelve months' notice thereafter.

SOUTH AFRICAN INSTITUTE FOR MEDICAL RESEARCH.

The Association's grant to the Institute remained at £7,500 per annum. The Union Government contributed a like sum.

The Institute continues to render valuable service to Members of the Association.

Dr. E. H. Cluver has been appointed Director of the Institute in succession to the late Sir Spencer Lister. At the same time Dr. George Buchanan was appointed Deputy Director.

NATIVES ON COLLIERIES.

An agreement was concluded between the Collieries Committee of the Transvaal Chamber of Mines and the Association governing the employment of Portuguese Natives on Collieries: The new agreement replaces the agreement concluded in 1914, the terms of which were largely out of date.

The Collieries have introduced a cinema circuit, similar to that in operation on the gold mines, for the entertainment of their Native employees.

DESERTIONS.

The attached Statement "E" shows the desertions among Natives employed by Members for each year 1935 to 1940.

MEMBERSHIP.

Rietfontein (No. 11) Gold Mines Ltd., resigned its membership on 26th February, 1940. There was no other change in the membership during the year.

The Board also learnt, with much regret, of the death, on 17th October, 1940, of Mr. I. I. Adams, who for many years was Buyer for the Association.

STAFF.

Dr. Leonard Bostock, who held the important post of District Manager of the Association in Portuguese East Africa since 1st October, 1916, retired on the 15th January, 1940; whereupon Mr. Alberto Abrantes, who had entered the Association's service in February, 1902, was appointed to the position.

Military Service.—At the 31st December, 1940, forty-one members of the Association's staff were on full-time military service.

MEDICAL REJECTS FROM MINES.

(a) EAST COAST :-

On the 31st December, 1939, 39 Natives remained in hospital.

During the year, 1,910 East Coast convalescent Natives were received for repatriation from the Mines. Of these, 1,173 were repatriated, 5 died, 6 were transferred to the Miners' Phthisis Bureau wards, 694 were returned to the Mines, 1 was discharged, and 70 remained in the hospital at the end of the year awaiting repatriation.

(b) BRITISH SOUTH AFRICAN:—

On the 31st December, 1939, 83 Natives remained in hospital.

During the year, 5,302 Natives were received from the Mines. Of these, 3,586 were conducted to their homes, 8 died, 26 were transferred to the Miners' Phthisis Bureau wards, 1,598 were returned to the Mines, 8 were discharged, 2 were sent to Rietfontein Lazaretto, and 157 were in the hospital at the end of the year.

(c) TROPICALS :-

On the 31st December, 1939, there were 8 Natives in hospital.

During the year, 554 Tropical Natives were received for repatriation from the Mines. Of these, 346 were repatriated, 187 were returned to the Mines, 6 were sent to the Rietfontein Lazaretto, 4 were transferred to the Miners' Phthisis Bureau wards, 3 died, and 16 remaine 1 in hospital at the end of the year awaiting repatriation.

REPORT OF THE PROCEEDINGS

At the Thirty-ninth Ordinary General Meeting, held in Johannesburg on Monday, 28th April, 1941.

Present:—Mr. W. H. A. Lawrence, Chairman; Sir William Dalrymple, K.B.E., LL.D., Messrs. G. H. Beatty, A. S. Hersov, G. Carleton Jones, Louis Marks, C. S. McLean, Bertie Moses, Dr. Hans Pirow, V. J. Ronketti, F. A. Unger and H. A. Wilson, with Mr. H. C. Wellbeloved (Manager) and Mr. David Smith (representing the Secretaries—the Transvaal Chamber of Mines).

Notice of Meeting.—The Notice convening the Meeting was taken as read.

Minutes.—The Minutes of the 38th Ordinary General Meeting, held on the 22nd April, 1940 (which had been circulated), were taken as read, and confirmed.

Annual Report and Accounts.—The Report of the Board of Management and the Audited Accounts for the year ended 31st December, 1940 (which had been circulated), were taken as read.

The Chairman moved the adoption of the Report and Accounts as circulated.

Mr. G. H. Beatty seconded the motion, which was carried unanimously.

Auditors.—(a) On the motion of the Chairman, seconded by Mr. C. S. McLean, (i) the remuneration of Messrs. Douglas, Low & Co. and Messrs. Saml. Thomson & Young, for their audit of the 1940 accounts, was fixed at 400 guineas each; and (ii) the action of the Executive Committee in having awarded each of the two firms an honorarium of 100 guineas in connection with their audit of the 1939 accounts was confirmed.

(b) On nomination by Mr. F. A. Unger on behalf of the Brakpan Mines Ltd., seconded by Mr. G. Carleton Jones, Messrs. Douglas, Low & Co. (Incorporated Accountants) and Messrs. Saml. Thomson & Young (Chartered Accountants) were unanimously re-elected Auditors to the Association.

The Proceedings then terminated.
