Dear

The recently constituted Christian Council of South Africa has decided to form a medical missions committee under the aegis of the Council, and has requested me to act as Convener to form the Committee. I am not a member of the medical profession, but my work brings me into close touch with medical missions throughout Southern Africa and also into direct contact with Non-European medical and health needs. I shall be glad if by serving as Convener of this Committee I can assist medical missionary effort and the Non-European peoples.

I shall be grateful if you will serve as a member of the Committee. Most of the work will have to be done by post, by means of memoranda prepared by myself or by individual members of the Committee and circulated for the observations of other members. But it is hoped that it will be possible for members to meet together once in a while to consider important questions of medical missionary policy. The Christian Council will meet in Johannesburg or Pretoria in January next, and I hope that it will be possible for members of the Committee to meet in conference a day or two before.

The Executive Committee of the Christian Council has asked me to outline the terms of reference of the Committee, and I have ventured to draft these for the prior consideration of members of the Committee. I shall be grateful if you will let me have your views on them before OCTOBER 10th, 1936, as the Executive Committee of the Christian Council meets on October 14th. As you will note, the proposed terms cover a wide range, but it is not intended that all the items shall be dealt with at once. They serve to indicate, rather, the matters which the Committee may be expected at any time to consider and pronounce upon, or matters on which the Council may from time to time ask the Committee to advise it.


Dear Mr. Bottrill,

Dear Mr. Rheinallt-Jones,

With thanks I have to acknowledge your letter of 21st inst. The Berlin Mission is running a Dispensary on the Mission Station Kreuzburg, Farm Roodewal, 20 Miles from Pietersburg on the main road to Louis Trichardt. This Dispensary is visited regularly every fortnight by the Gov. District Surgeon. It is under the care of our Native Minister stationed there. But this is not satisfactory at all. A trained nurse should be appointed for this post. The Berlin Mission Society however is unable to provide the salary for such a nurse. Therefore we would be very much obliged if we could get assistance from the Provincial Funds.

If the Conference will be held on 14th of October here in Pietersburg I will attend same.

I might mention that we have 3 more Dispensaries on the Mission Stations Tshakoma, Georgenholtz and Khalavha all situated in the Zoutpansberg, they are under the control of Dr. Aitken, Gooldville. The 3 nurses on these Mission Stations get their salary from the Health Department by help of Dr. Aitken.

Thank you for your communication of the 21st regarding the proposed meeting to be held at Pietersburg on Oct: 13th to prepare for the Provincial Hospital Commission. I regret that it is impossible for anyone from this diocese to attend the meeting. I wired to the Archdeacon of Swaziland in whose jurisdiction the Endhlozana hospital is, but he has replied today that neither he nor Brooke, the priest-in-charge, is able to go. I would come myself if it were possible. I am however writing to the Bishop of Pretoria to ask if his representative may include our case within his. If he cannot I shall be more than content to leave our interests in your hands.

If you will let me hear the conclusions arrived at by the conference I will take steps to arrange that you shall be supplied with the facts about Endhlozana so that you may act for us in any way which seems best to you. The main fact is that the hospital is increasing its usefulness almost daily, but we are faced with a cash deficit.

Dear Mr. Jones,

I think that my wife has already told you that the meeting of the Pietersburg Division of the S.A. Medical Association on the 1st of this month resulted in an amicable settlement of the questions affecting medical missionaries, which had been giving rise to some anxiety here. The whole thing resolved itself into a feeling of irritation over Dr. Rosset's so called private practice outside the hospital. However Dr. Rosset was able to point out that for the last 18 months he had been confining himself to the work of the hospital except in cases of emergencies, and we were able to come to an understanding as to the limits within which he should confine his practice. I think that some of the members knew before the meeting that the Medical Council would not take any action, and this helped to make them more reasonable.

We are wondering very much when we are likely to be able to place our views about the hospitals before the Commission or the Administrator. Rosset and I are both anxious that the matter should be settled before the next financial year, so we hope it will be possible to do something before the estimates are drawn up. If you will let me know when we are to come to Pretoria, I'll arrange with Rosset for us to travel together.

One or two things have come to my notice since our meeting. I asked Rosset to let me see the Budget which they had prepared for the Administrator some months ago, and on looking through this I found that their actual cost per native patient per day was 3s. Id., which is more in line with the other figures. I think that their previous estimate of 1s. 9d. was based on the difference between their present revenue and the expenditure.

If you will turn up the latest Official Year Book of the Union you will find on page 285 full particulars of the basis of subsidies paid to Provincial Hospitals. It is a pity that we did not realise that we could refer to these during our meeting at Pietersburg.

I have also taken the following figures from the Year Book. In the year 1934-35 the Transvaal received the sum of £482,449 from native Pass Fees (Page 840). In the same year the total expenditure on hospitals was £405,764. (Page 845). If ~~theses~~ these figures are correct it would appear that the revenue from Pass Fees is more than sufficient to pay for all hospitals in the Province, European and Native.
