Non-European Health Week.

A Non-European Health Week has been arranged under the aegis of the Public Health and Non-European and Native Affairs Departments, commencing on the 23rd October, 1938, and terminating on the 30th October, 1938.

This will be inaugurated by His Worship the Mayor at a mass meeting of Non-Europeans on the Wemmer Grounds, Loveday Street Extension, at 4 p.m. on Sunday the 23rd October, followed by a procession through the City led by the Paladin's Band.

A CENTRAL EXHIBITION will be held in the "Bantu World" building, Polly Street South, with lecture centres at the Bantu Men's Social Centre and all native locations.

The programme will include the following:-

At the Central Exhibition health talks will be given daily at 3 p.m. and 8 p.m. There will also be demonstrations of cookery, physical culture, first aid, etc., etc.

Talk on Venereal Disease in the ARUNDEL CHURCH HALL, Sieviewright Avenue, Doornfontein. (Separate meetings for men and women).

A musical programme has been arranged by Mr. Jack Phillips in his hall at 5 POLLY STREET, during which a programme of health films and a talk on tuberculosis will be given. A most interesting evening's entertainment is promised.

merit will be a secondary consideration except
where ideas coincide.

Closing Date: Entries must reach the Medical Officer of Health
not later than the 14th. November, 1938. They
may be handed in at the Public Health Department,
Escom House, or at the Superintendent's Office in
any of the Native Townships.
