My dear Mr. President,

Herewith copy of letter I have this day addressed to the Chief Native Commissioner for your information. I should be grateful if you could return it as I have to send it to Nongoma on whose behalf the letter is written. I hope you will approve.

My comments on the Resolutions of Congress have involved me in some difficulty with the Local Health Commission. I am asked not to write on controversial matters in the press as that might involve the Commission. I have explained that I am Provincial Secretary of Congress in this Province and a prospective candidate for the Native Representative Council and that the comments were and are made at the request of African leaders. The matter will be discussed at their full meeting on the 20th instant. I find that my comments have excited a great deal of discussion among certain Europeans in this town in which our Mr. Lugg is interested. It is a pity that Congress has no funds to guarantee me even a two years salary. My answer to the Commission would be a resignation to enable me to devote all my time to national organisation.
