

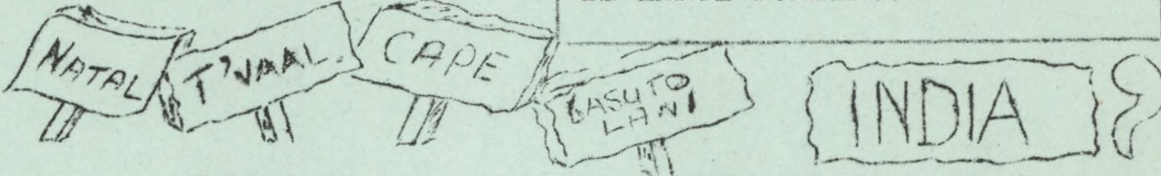

RESISTERS SENTENCED : NOW 280.

Yesterday 5 resistors were imprisoned in Durban. The batch was led by P. SIMON, a factory worker. There are now 280 resistors in jail.

Last night a batch of nine resistors went into action. Reports from Durban indicate that VOLUNTEERS ARE ENROLLING IN LARGE NUMBERS.

## ★ Mrs Gool's Successful Tour !!

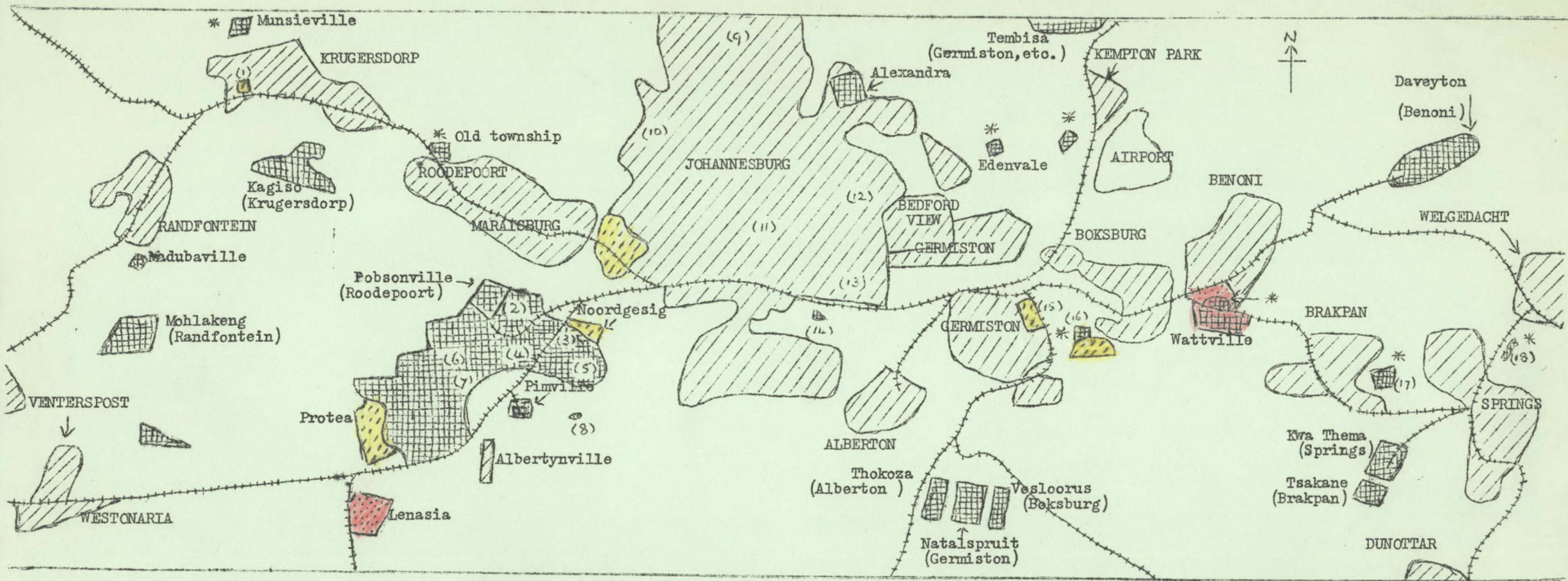




