p. 6230. Reference to oppressive laws and passes for women. One day the Government will load the last stone on the camel's back. Unlike the camel the people will not sit down, they will say we want freedom. We want to be equal. We want the Freedom Charter.

p. 6271. Reference to sections of Freedom Charter. There shall be freedom and security for all. "Away with sickness. The Government will never supply us with enough hospitals. As a matter of fact this Government makes me sick. Why are we never told what is being done for the people in the U.S.S.R? Why were the English thrown out of India? You can no longer pull the wool over the sheeps' eyes."

p. 6291. We have brothers and sisters in Bechuanaland, Kenya and also in the U.S.S.R. and China.

p. 6291 : Reference to expulsion of Soviet Consul. "I think the Government is jealous because the African leaders were invited to the party and they were not."

p. 6291 : The struggle will not be easy. Congress must take the lead and organize and mobilize the people. Constant mobilization and talking will be required.

Explanation of C.O.P. and Freedom Charter which is the will of the people.

p. 6312. "We must fight the Government by all means and we will beat the Government. We must strike them such a blow that they will never recover. That is the way we must work. Down with the Pass Laws. Make the people join the Congresses. Then we will give the Government a blow."

p. 6313. We will fight for freedom side by side until we have won, and we will win in our lifetime.

A.N.C. meeting, Moffat Square, Lady Selbourne,
Location, 18/3/1956

Purpose - apparently to protest against
pass laws and "organise A.N.C."

p.6321. There are two roads. One for

p.6321. In condemning apartheid, the people
and we (A.N.C.) shall work for freedom of
the people, Black and White.

p.6321. Sweep Strijdom and his mad men
