

We suggest that resolutions be made as follows

- 1) A full statement of the concern of Congress over the crime wave particularly on the Rand be made on behalf of Congress by the President - substantially on the lines of the address and published in the Public Press.
- 2) That a beputation be made to the Prime Minister to discuss with him the fundamental questions of :-
 - a) African disabilities - viz :-
 - ① Demand for full opportunity for Education, including Teachers salaries etc.
 - ② Adult Education and provision for social and Recreational facilities.
 - ③ Demand for full direct Representation
 - ④ Land - Provision of more land for the African ~~and~~ in urban and rural areas on individual Tenure.
 - ~~⑤ Subsidisation of~~
 - ⑤ Removal of Pass laws that criminalise the African.
 - ⑥ Recognition of African Trade Unions under I.C. Act.
 - ⑦ Direct relief for drought stricken areas.

(8) That resolutions on Education be given to ~~the~~ Professor Matthews;

(9) The crime wave.

- 4 Now that S.A. has been found guilty of having failed in carrying out her duties of guardianship towards her Subject Races, is U.N.O. in a position to see that these duties are carried out in accordance with the Spirit and aims of the United Nations' Charter?
- 5 Is fusion with the All African Convention desirable? If so are there any steps taken to bring this about?
- 6 Is there any Federation of all the Non-European political Organisations? If not don't you think such a Body would morally and materially strengthen the Non-European Cause?
