KOMMISSIE VAN ONDERSOEK INSAKE OPLEIDING VAN MEDIESE

OPDRAG

Om ondersoek in te stel na -

die bestuur van hospitale wat voorsiening maak of mag maak vir die kliniese voorligting van universiteitstudente wat 'n graad- of diplomakursus volg in geneeskunde, higiëne en volksgesondheid, tandheelkunde, diëtetiek, radiografie, fisiotherapie, verplegings- en beroepsterapie, met inbegrip van voorsiening vir nagraadse studie en navorsing wat nie spesifiek toegespits is nie op die verkryging van 'n graad of diploma nie, en veral ten opsigte van:

- (a) personeelreëlings met betrekking tot
 - (i) gesamentlike universiteits-hospitaalaanstellings;
 - (ii) die verhouding tussen doserende, navorsings- en kliniese roetine-pligte van die personeel wat gesamentlike aanstellings beklee of wat as dosente moet optree selfs as hulle slegs hospitaalaanstellings beklee;
 - (iii) studentegetalle (ongegradueerdes, inwonende gemeeshere en nagraadse studente);
 - (iv) getal pasiënte (buite- en binne-pasiënte);
- (b) huisvesting en geriewe wat spesiaal benodig word vir onderrig en navorsing, bv. kliniese sale, projektors, demonstrasiekamers, sykamers, toerusting en personeel wat verantwoordlik is vir die opstel en bewaring van aantekeninge en siekgevälle;
- (c) die administratiewe en geldelike onderlinge verhoudings tussen hospitale en universiteite waar studente opgelei word, met inagneming van hul inkomste aan studentegelde, staatsubsidies vir gesondheids- en opvoedkundige dienste en die behoeftes ten opsigte van personeel en geriewe vir onderrig en navorsing.

TERMS OF REFERENCE

To enquire into -

the conduct of hospitals which make or may make provision for the clinical instruction of university students preparing for degrees or diplomas in medicine, hygiene and public health, dentistry, dietetics, radiography, physiotherapy, nursing and occupational therapy, and including provision for post-graduate study and research not specifically directed to the attainment of a degree or diploma, with particular reference to -

- (a) staffing arrangements in relation to
 - (i) combined university - hospital appointments;
 - (ii) the balance between teaching, research and routine clinical duties of personnel holding combined appointments or with teaching duties even if holding only hospital appointments;
 - (iii) student numbers (under-graduates, interns, post-graduates);
 - (iv) patient numbers (outpatients and inpatients);
- (b) accommodation and facilities specially required for teaching and research, e.g. clinical theatres, projectors, viewing-rooms, side-rooms, apparatus and personnel for taking and storing of case records;
- (c) the administrative and financial interrelationships between teaching hospitals and teaching universities, having regard to student fee income, to State subsidisation of health and of education services, and to the desiderata in respect of staff and facilities for teaching and research.
