

# African National Congress

Greetings,

Be it known that the Special Convention of the African National Congress assembled at Bloemfontein on the 1st. January 1926 in Special Session, has approved of, and confirmed the amendment of secs. 103, 104, 105, 106&107 chapter VII of the African National Congress Constitution made and submitted by the committee appointed by the Fourteenth Annual Convention of the African National Congress for the amendment of the constitution.

All Territories, Provinces and Provincial branches in possession of any money contributed and collected in the name of the African National Congress must forward *same* forthwith through their local banks to the Standard Bank of South Africa, Johannesburg, which is the Bank of the Head Quarters of the African National Congress. Further, all bona fide debts, current, and future accounts of any branch of the African National Congress will be paid by the Head Quarters on receipt by the Treasurer General of a requisition form, for his consideration, and payment, notwithstanding however, that all debts exceeding £10 will, on the advice of the Treasurer General, be submitted to the African National Congress for consideration. Sections 83, 84, 85, 86, and 87 Chapter VI 98, 90, 91, have been amended as follows:—

That from the beginning of this year 1926 each and every member of the African National Congress in all Provinces shall pay a membership fee of 2s. 6d. and a monthly levy of 1s. on each calendar month, which money shall be forwarded through their local banks to the Standard Bank of South Africa in Johannesburg as stated above.

Any Territory, Province or branch of the African National Congress which shall defy the foregoing presents shall forfeit its right as a branch of the parent body.

Congress has a right to sue any of its members for the recovery of its monies, etc etc,
