

PRESIDENTIAL REPORT SEASON 1981/1982

Today is one year since I took office - I cannot say it has been easy going - but it has been very fruitful for the Board. At times there has been sleepless nights, but as always obstacles are in our way, some satisfactory and others not so satisfactory, yet we shall have to overcome all the difficulties for the cause we believe in, and the day will come however, when we shall all sing together and rejoice.

"Free at last, free at last, Thanks God Almighty, we are free at last."

I would like to touch on some of the more important events of the season 1981/1982.

The success of the Board was beyond our imagination, in the season gone by, we enjoyed extraordinary success. There has been many outstanding features, but what possibly gave us more joy was that Players that mattered are back with us, and the teams "on the other side" began to see the light of the day.

There are two Sub Unions affiliated to us, and as you are aware, some of them were previously affiliated to the Transvaal Cricket Council and had thought that maybe they are heading for more problems, with lack of grounds, but this was soon overcome. Our greatest truimph was the fact that we played in Lenasia. At the beginning of the Season, when we applied to the City Council for playing fields in the Johannesburg area, we were given all, but were refused i.r.o. Lenasia, and were told to apply Johannesburg Cricket Council. We, in turn, refused to apply to the Johannesburg Cricket Council since we do not recognise them. We made it quite clear at the Meeting, that we are prepared to share the Cricket Fields equally.

In November 1981, after seeing some fields in Lenasia, where teams from the Transvaal Cricket Council played, standing empty, we decided to occupy them. There were verbal exchanges between our Players and Players from Transvaal Cricket Council.

Dr Bacher, the Chairman of the Transvaal Cricket Council, phoned me to ask why we had taken the Grounds I said the Grounds belong to the People of Lenasia and not to any particular body or Organisation and since most of the Teams from Lenasia are with us, we felt that we are entiled to play in Lenasia, as this was something that has been denied to us since 1977, and that most of the Transvar Cricket Council Teams had crossed the floor and joined us.

More problems were created for us and grounds were sabotaged and not properly maintained. The Groundsman refused to fix the Turf wickets or lay the carpets. Our Players and Officials rolled up their sleeves and did the necessary themselves before starting with the match.

"This already showed the determination of the men in the Transvaal Cricket Board."

This coming season we are going to apply again to the City Council for the playing fields in all areas, after all, we are the controlling body in Johannesburg and the surrounding areas, as we hold the majority of cricketers.

The Board awarded special certificates to all the players in the Junior League who plays on Saturdays indicating that they are members of the Transvaal Cricket Board and have played their part in the struggle for Non Racial Sports.

Our success was not only with the teams, as we did well in the Interprovincial Fixtures, after being Annual Wooden Spoonists since 1977, we improved tremendously and finished second on the South Africa Cricket Board Table.

In keeping up with a policy established the previous season, the Board took some of the Interprovincials "To the People". The match against Eastern Province was played in Actonville, Benoni and the clash against Natal was staged in Roshnee, Vereeniging.

Attendances at these matches were much better than the previous seasons and improved with each Interprovincial.

The major disappointment for the Board came when the "B" team failed to make the final. They won both their matches, only failing to dislodge Natal "B's" last stubborn wicket. Griqualand went through to the Booley Bowl.

We have achieved what we have decided, that is, to go to the people and make them see the light, make them see what is happening, and what has been done, instead of seeing the game, they must see the cause.

Our Board has been taken note of that this is not just another Cricketing Body. When English Rebels came to South Africa, the B.B.C. interviewed Officials and Players of the Board. The television programme is now viewed by all throughout the world. The real feather in the cap came when were were also told of the true decision taken by the Test and County Cricket Union in connection with the rebel cricketers.

As you are all aware of the fact that we have been branded as Politicians - but who makes the Laws - not us - the crux of the matter is they, the Transvaal Cricket Council and South African Union wants to discuss cricket with us. I cannot see this happening, or to have dialogue until South Africa becomes a Non-Racial Society where everyone is treated on the same basis and has the same priviledges.

Financially, the Board has improved from the previous season, and are not in the red, in fact, in the coming season we should have a healthy bank balance in spite of the fact that our Cricketers will not travel by road for Interprovincial fixtures.

There has been encouragement from old cricketers as they are coming forward and offering their assistance. They are keen to get back in the mainstream of Non-Racial Cricket.

To Thistles, I would say, Congratulations for firmly establishing themselves as the strongest team of the Board, for taking the title once again, and to Klerksdorp Delfos from annexing the "B" Division trophy.

Finally, I would like to put on record that this Board was founded on Non-Racial principles and therefore let that be known to all, the time has now come not just for words but for deeds.

As from this coming season 1982/1983, we are not going to look back but march forward with one voice and one thought.

SECRETARIAL REPORT - 1981/1982

SUBMITTED TO THE FIFTH ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING OF THE TRANSVAAL CRICKET BOARD

Mr President, Delegates and Members,

I am privileged to submit for your consideration this report on the activities of the Board for the 1981/1982 Season.

1. LEAGUE CRICKET

My congratulations to the Thistles C.C. for winning the Senior League competition for the Fourth successive time. Also to Klerksdorp Delfos C.C. for winning the "B" section League competition. I wish to stress that any team wishing to do well must give priority to net practices, to the development of basic skills and techniques and to reach peak physical fitenss before the season commences. I observed with great concern and disappointment that as the season progressed so did the amount of players attending net practices decrease. In fact some teams "abandoned" net practices.

While the standard of play was hampered by ill-prepared wickets or nonprepared wickets the standard was of a reasonable nature. Obviously the standard will improve by playing on well prepared wickets but will also improve if teams and cricketers take upon themselves to devote and pay attention to the development of basic skills and techniques.

2. HOWA BOWL

Western Province again emerged as worthy winners and although we finished runners up, we were never a serious threat to Western Province due to a number of indifferent performances. The standard of play showed an improvement compared to that of the previous season and with more attention being paid to improving upon batting and bowling techniques the standard can only improve.

3. BOOLEY TROPHY

Our "B" team threw away their chances of meeting Western Province in the final by bungling their game against G. West. Set to score a modest total for outright victory the lack applying correct basic skills and techniques in batting resulted in the match being drawn.

Room for improvement exists and we hope that mistakes will not be repeated. W. Province emerged as winners of the competition.

4. SCHOOLS CRICKET

A lot of activity took place in Primary and High Schools' Cricket. Although the primary schools did not do well in their National Tournament, the high schools fared well in their National Competition.

I would like to repeat that high schools cricket must be played throughout the season and not end once the Transvaal team is selected to play in the National Tournament.

5. JUNIOR CRICKET

Junior Cricket, which was played on Saturday afternoons, was encouraging to watch, and if more senior players assist and encourage the Juniors in umpiring, field placing etc. the Juniors will be motivated to reach greater heights.

5. JUNIOR CRICKET (contd)

The Board has embraked on drawing up a blue print for a coaching scheme and it can only be a step in the right direction.

We must always remember that if our children and ourselves too reject coaching from racist sportsmen we are duty bound to provide our children with the necessary coaching to the best of our ability.

An effort must be made to involve parents in our Junior Cricket.

6. S.A. CRICKET BOARD

Tvl., Border, E.P., G.W., Natal., S.A.P.S.S.A., S.A.S.S.A., S-W Districts., W.P., and Boland. The majority of the affiliates reported increases in membership and attempts at recruiting new members by clubs must be an ongoing process.

The Board attended all SACB meetings and I would like to see that travelling costs be set aside for delegates attending SACB meetings instead of relying on delegates themselves to pay their fares.

7. ADMINISTRATION AND MEETINGS

Administratively the Board functioned reasonably well. There was, however, the usual slackness on the part of certain teams in the carrying out of their duties. On many occasions teams should be heavily fined for not submitting, for example, score sheets, but such measures would obviously affect the organisation and the teams detrimentally. My suggestion is that all those laws that have not been effectively applied be removed and have a Constitution that is entirely workable in practice.

The usual monthly meetings were held and were well attended. A high level of discussion and debate was maintained throughout. I wish to make an appeal to all teams to bring to the attention of the Board all problems/complaints they have so that they could be resolved at meetings instead of complaining about them at "Street Corners."

8. SPONSORSHIP

It has become abundantly clear that due to the principle stand taken by the Board in respect of our struggle for Non-Racial Cricket requests for Sponsorship have borne no fruit. Therefore Fund-raising Campaigns for the coming season must be pursued vigorously and the fullest co-operation must be forthcoming from all quarters.

9. INTERNATIONAL CRICKET CONFERENCE

The SACU again attempted to get into I.C.C. and failed miserably. The following three examples just about make SACU's claim that cricket in South Africa is Non-Racial laughable:

 The <u>GOVERNMENT</u> has turned down the applications of two sports clubs for international status to admit people of all races to their premises. The Minister said the conditions laid down in the licences that Liquor could only be sold or supplied to a "Non-White" person who was a competitor, an official or a guest of a club member - RDM 17.2.1982.

- 2. The circular told Principals they would have to choose between "A" League - open only to TED schools and "B" League in swimming, netball, hockey, rugby, cricket and tennis. The "B" League in open to private schools - many of which Black pupils - and to any TED schools of a opting for it. RDM 17.2.1982.
- Minister of National Education, Dr G. Viljoen, said yesterday that the Government remained convinced of the need for separate schools and education departments for different races - The Star 1.5.1982.

10. GROUNDS

The Johannesburg City Council showed its hand when they assured us that the wickets in Lenasia would be prepared. Not only did they not honour their assurance but they have not replied to our letter demanding an explanation.

The financial crisis surrounding the Lenasia Stadium has brought up an interesting question. Does the Johannesburg Cricket Council to which. Grounds in Lenasia are allocated exist? According to a recent Rand Daily Mail Report : a) The Stadium is owned by the City Council and administered by the J.C.C. b) Creditors entered into contracts with the J.C.C.

c) J.C.C. Officials said the T.C.C. was responsible for the stadium and

d) J.C.C. stopped functioning two years ago when most of the Office Bearers became part of the T.C.C.

I would suggest that our Board use the Lenasia Stadium on the following conditions:-

- 1. The name revert back to Lenasia Stadium and all traces of the previous name be removed
- 2. The Johannesburg City Council maintain the Stadium like all the other fields in Lenasia
- 3. All the present financial committments in respect of the Stadium be settled by the involved parties.

4/ ...

11. CONSISTENCY

All those affiliated to the Board have committed themselves to the cause of Non-Racialism and thereby have rejected what T.C.C. stands for. Therefore, is it consistent for some of our players to attend matches organised by the T.C.C.?

In similar light, is it consistent for some of our players to attend matches organised by the NPSL?

Both the T.C.C. and NPSL are intent upon seeing S.A. back in the International fold, encourage tours and and from S.A. and claim that their respectice sports are Non-Racial.

We know better and we know the TRUTH and therefore we have committed ourselves to the BOARD and SACOS. Therefore I appeal to all those who want to have the best of both worlds to GET OUT, YOU ARE TRAITORS __in our midst.

Only if we are being consistent will we win the hearts of THOSE WHO OPPOSE US and enlist the support of those who are sympathetic to us.

12. TRANSFER OF TEACHERS TO REMOTE AREAS

It is deplorable that Teachers throughout the country who, to the best of our knowledge, have excellent professional records generally and who are in most cases directly involved in SACOS, be transferred to remote areas.

This type of action is indicative of the measures the Establishment is prepared to go to, to impede the struggle for Non-Racial Sport.

13. RECOMMENDATIONS

1. Efforts to win cricketers over to our cause must be intensified.

- 2. Clubs must concentrate on tightening their administration and BOARD officials must be invited to club meetings.
- . 3. Each member of the Board must familiarise himself with the principles and policies of SACOS and be able to expound them when called upon to do so.

The past season was a very successful one and my thanks go to one and all for their assistance, guidance and co-operation.

November. There were no matches played between the 7 th and 28 th November because the players were busy with their final examinations.
