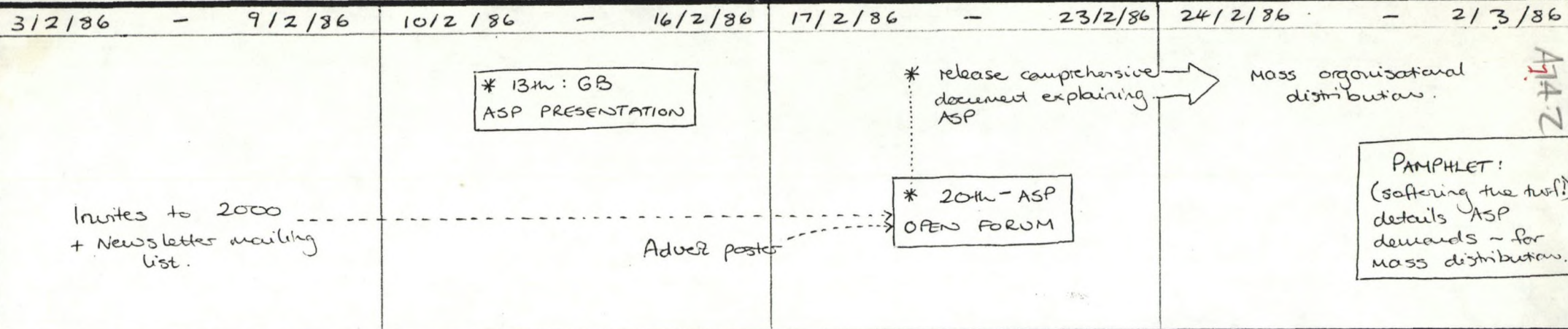
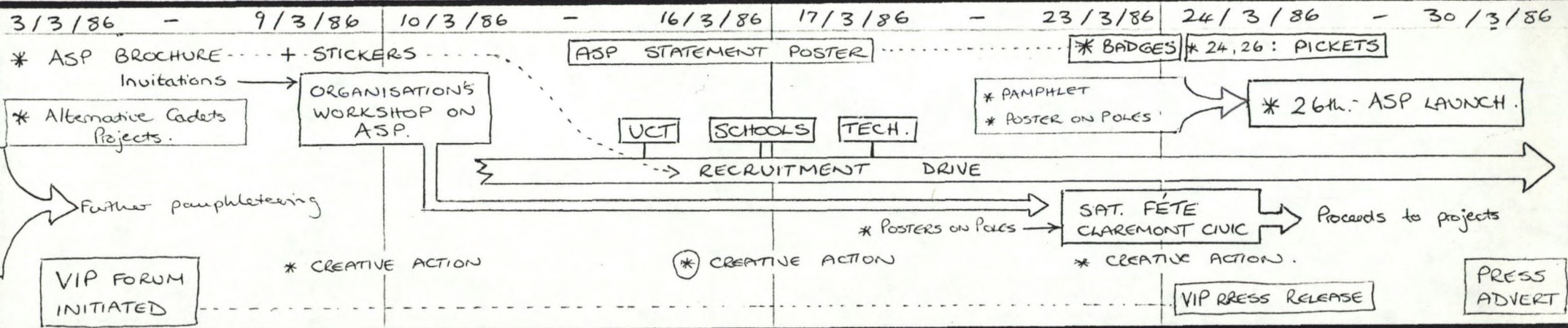

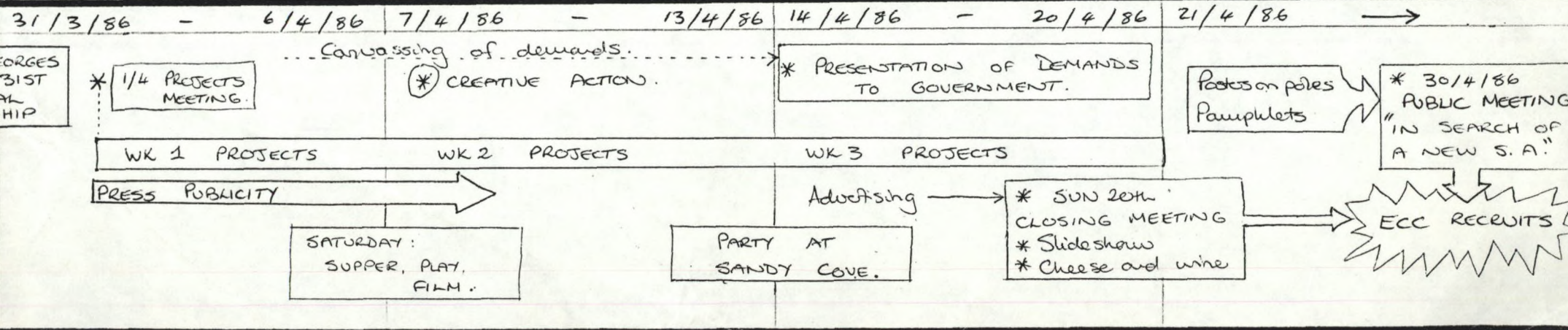

PROJECT TIMETABLE

The meeting point for volunteers is at the ECC office, 1 Rhodesview, 435 Main Road, Observatory - opposite the graveyard, on the corner of Main Roads and Bowden/Anzio Roads, unless otherwise specified. Volunteers will be phoned before projects, but if you have a problem or need to change dates etc, please contact your project coordinator. Or phone Paula between 10am and 2pm at 479170.

TUES 1 + WED 2 : BRUCE DUNCAN HANOVER PARK HOME - gardening - schools project

SUN 6 : LITTER DRIVE - meet at 12.30 pm - coordinator Chippy (473758) Bring any equipment you want - e.g. gloves/pointed sticks etc

WED 9 : BRUCE DUNCAN - BRIDGETOWN - CHILDREN'S HOME under construction - lay out lawn - meet at 9.30 am

bring your own lunch and a spade (coordinator Chippy 473758)

WED 9 : EVENING - peace ribbon/mend toys for Cowley House - meet at 7.30 pm (coordinator Paula 479170 (10-2pm) home 477083, for venue/details) Materials provided - bring ideas or materials if you can to design and make a section of the Peace Ribbon (presently half a kilometer long and growing!). Also help mend/clean toys donated for the children at Cowley House. *(Full)*

SAT 12 : COWLEY HOUSE - houses the offices of the Western Province Council of Churches/Dependents Conference, an organisation which assists the dependents of political prisoners', and is home for families who come to Cape Town to visit their imprisoned relatives. Project involves clearing the grounds and gardening, before laying a lawn and painting a peace mural on the garden wall. Meet 12.30pm - coordinator Justin 643831 (20 - 30 volunteers): bring a gardening tool you want to use! *(Full)*

SAT 12 : EVENING - Cowley House entertainment - organise/provide entertainment for visitors to Cowley House - possibly provide supper (any volunteers?)/video/music (coordinator - James Kibby 231893) (10 - 20 volunteers maximum) Meet at Cowley House, Chapel Street, Woodstock at 6 pm. *(Full)*

SAT 12 : CYCLE TRACK CONSTRUCTION - help lay/construct a concrete cycle track at a pre-school on the Cape Flats. Meet at 12.30 pm (coordinator Alastair 477181) (10-15 volunteers): anyone welcome, but preferably with some technical skills/experience, or keen to learn.

SUN 13 : BRUCE DUNCAN BRIDGETOWN - levelling grounds/clearing sand/rubble, at children's home under construction - meet at 9.30 am (coordinator Therese/Barbara 479272) (bring your own spade). As many volunteers as possible needed, bring your own spade - quite strenuous work. Also, any volunteers not keen/able to do such strenuous work, to arrange preparation of simple lunch - provided by ECC? Could be done on Sunday morning and brought out to site, or on Saturday.

SUN 13 : COWLEY HOUSE contd: meet at 9.30 am; (to lay out lawn/possibly paint a colourful/peace-ful mural on wall, which might also involve a children's section). Coordinators: Justin (643831) or Josie (477181). *(Full)*

SUN 13 : CYCLE TRACK contd ... meet at 9.30 am to finish laying cycle track if necessary. Same volunteers if possible, but not necessarily. (Coordinator: Alastair 477181 to confirm)

TUES 15 : PAINTING AT PRESCHOOL - smallish painting job, painting bathrooms and kitchen at pre-school on Cape Flats. 5-10 keen painters needed - meet at 9.30 am (coordinator Mike - 477083)

WED 16 : BRUCE DUNCAN BRIDGETOWN contd/BRUCE DUNCAN STRANDFONTEIN CAMPSITE - begin preparation - clear bush/hack trees (coordinator Therese 470567/Chippy - 473758) - meet at 9.30am, bring spade if former project; ax/saw/cutting implement if latter - coordinators will confirm which).

THURS 17 : COWLEY HOUSE - finish off mural on wall - meet at 9.30am: bring a paintbrush. Anyone who can paint/colour in is welcome - no special artistic skill/talent required, nor is work necessarily very

strenuous. Coordinator - Josie 477181

SAT 19 : BRUCE DUNCAN STRANDFONTEIN CAMPSITE contd - hack bushes/trees to clear campsite for use. (As many volunteers as possible, bring your own hacksaw/ax etc) meet at 12.30 pm, for a strenuous afternoon's work! (Coordinators: Therese - 470567; Cosimo)

SUN 20 : BRUCE DUNCAN STRANDFONTEIN CAMPSITE contd .. meet at 9.30 am. Bring your own equipment, lunch provided. Any volunteers to assist in preparing lunch please sign up at projects table. Coordinators: Therese 470567/Cosimo

SUN 20 : END PROJECTS JOL/SOCIAL EVENING - venue and other details later from Alastair/recruitment group - 6pm onwards.

Various social projects: assisting in the ongoing work of welfare organisations - more information at the table for any interested volunteers (coordinator: Therese 470567)

- * even, matchboxes and dead matches - for making collages etc.

These donations can be dropped at the ECC office between 10am and 2pm Mon to Friday.

Finally - a reminder that the work of the organisations we will be involved with during this campaign, does not end when ECC's campaign ends! The needs they serve will continue to exist, and so will the need for volunteers. (For example, Cowley House is almost always home to the families of political prisoners, and the house-mother is always keen to have volunteers who are prepared to host families, whether this involves taking children to the beach/or out for a drive, or whatever.) During the campaign, we hope you will find out more about what help organisations need, and if you can, get involved.
