she caught the bus to Vaal dam to
get the ~~plane~~ flying boat leaving at
11 a.m. Talking Morning Tea at 9-45 a.m.
when Mother got back. A M^{rs} Tridal
called about engaging a girl but Mother

said there was no one. M^m Reynolds called in the morning with a sketch of Van der Byls farm & had Morning Tea. Elisabeth English left.

June 1st Octave Wednesday.

No Mass. Very cold, & quite a heavy frost. Charlotte Pleasant left on the 8-36 a.m. train. A telegraph from the Assistant came in the afternoon saying "Excellent flight" sent from The Victoria Falls. Girls' Service started again.

Mass 7-15. M^m Burke & M^m Knox Shaw came to stay. Mother took girls marks at 6 p.m.
Mass 7-15. Everything as usual. Classes 6-45 p.m.
S.S. Aidan went into Johannesburg to see about a kitchen stove & decided upon nothing! Sister Angela, & Sister Ida went to Pretoria to shop. Sister Charity drove in to the dentist.

Mass 7-15. A very cold day. The Warden came to see Nother at 11-30 & said good bye as he was flying back to England the following Monday. Solemn Evening & Procession 6-30 p.m.

5th

String Mass 7 a.m. The new red vestments were used for the first time. A cable came through at 8-30 a.m. from Southampton telling of the safe arrival of the Assistant. Solemn Evening & Sermon 6-10 p.m. Very cold.

Whit-Monday.
6th

Mass 7-15. A letter from the Assistant from Kampala. The new "Esse" stove was put in at S. Margaret's. At 2 p.m. Nother drove over to Wardeley for the Meeting & took S.O. Forrester in order that she could drive the car. M^m Knox Shaw left in the morning.

Whit-Tuesday.
7th

Mass 7-15. Everything as usual.

Wednesday, Octave. Mass 7-15. In the morning, at breakfast we heard that Janice Van Schalkwyk had passed

away. A somewhat busy day, arranging about the funeral, many phone calls, & Mother went to the Cemetery in the morning to show Mr. Willman where the grave was to be; Next to M^m Field. Sister Tom & Sister Rosemary spent most of the day at the Van Schalkwyls & came to Holy & for some dinner. At 2 p.m. Mother & Sister Edna drove into Pretoria to do some shopping. Eisted service at 6-30 p.m.

Thursday Octave. Mar. 7-15. St. Margaret's party at 2-45 p.m.
9th It had to be early owing to Jenifer Van Schalkwyk's funeral to which most of the Sisters were going. It was a beautiful funeral. The choir of girls from Hillcrest came & all the Sisters & sang going to the grave "Be King of love" & after the Committal "Jesus lives." It was a perfect day of sunshine & absolutely still. Crowds of people came. The Chaplain took the service; both Fr. Evans & Fr. Black were present. There was one mass of flowers.

Friday. Octave. Mar 7-15. Sister Charity took Grace into Pretoria to have her baby baptised in the morning. S^r. J. Weild & Sister Edith Aida went in in the Van to shop. The Irene Company came, only 5! & Fr. Shelley C.R. No classes. In the afternoon Mother went to see M^m Van Schalkwyk who was staying at the Balfourings.

Saturday. Ember Day. Mar. 7-15. Fr. Shelley C.R. who left after dinner with Miss Viner. The rest left after afternoon tea except Miss Raven & Miss Casew who stayed until Sunday. At 1-45 p.m. Mother, Sister Edith Aida, Sister Angela, Sister Rosalie Anne, & Sister Isobel Weild went to the opening of the new Kindergarten School at Waverley.

All went very well but it was a grey afternoon & rain started at 5 p.m. Maripully, when all was over. Solemn Evening & Devotions 6-30 p.m.

12th Sun. Very Pass. A cloudy day after more rain during the night. Miss Raven & Miss Carew left after afternoon tea. Solemn Evening & Service 6-10 p.m.

Mass 7-15. Fr. Kring, who went back to Cromiston for the night for Corpus Christi. Heavy rain most of the morning. The other went into Preston to get flowers & Sister Ida, & Sister Angela also went in to shop.

Fr. Corpus Christi: Low Mass 7-15. The Chaplain. A High Mass at 10-30. C.B.S. The Chaplain, Fr. Jones, Fr. Maund, and six African servers. About 20 people came & the Chapel was quite full with those who came from the Household also. Fourteen of the party had refreshment after the Mass in the Recreation Room & the Africans on the lawn. The four Sisters from Waverley come in time for afternoon tea which we had in the Community Room & all were staying on until Saturday. A Fancy Dress dance for the girls at 6-15 p.m. quite good. Supper was 7-30 p.m.

17th Mass 7-15. The Chaplain. The four Waverley Sisters in Retreat. Sister Ethel, & Sister Theodore

of the Cross arrived in the Morning having started from Jane at 3 a.m.! They were both dead tired so went to bed after dinner. They came for their private Retreat. Girls Classes as usual.

Mass 7-15. Fr. King who left in the morning. The Wavell Sisters left after breakfast. Miss Kent, & Miss Nelson came for the night from Cervinton. The Holy Trnd Sisters started their long Retreat. Sister Charity in Retreat. Solemn Evening & Devotions 6-30 p.m. Marvelous weather, so warm. Sung Mass 7 a.m. Sister Margaret Anthony arrived from St. Cuthbert's for her visit. Miss Kent & Miss Nelson left after afternoon tea. Solemn Evening & Scrutin 6-10 p.m.

Vespers & Compline 4-3-4-5 p.m. followed by the tea 11. Sisters in all! & then just as we were finishing Sister Anicilla, & Sister Constance arrived for Retreat as they joined on! Much mirth during the tea! Girls Service 6-30 p.m. M^{rs} Millington came to tea.

Feast of Visitation of the B.V.M. £110. down on the year before. Sister Margaret Anthony went to Hillcrest for two nights. Solemn Wearing & Procession 6-30 p.m.

Trinity III. 3rd
Sunny Day 7 a.m. Mrs Bentham left for her Holiday. Sister Ida left for her visit to Jane. Sister Marjorie 55 yrs. came for Retreat. Miss Snyman from the Pretoria University came also Miss Baker to look after the telephone during Mrs Bentham's absence. Wearing & Sermon 6-10 p.m.
- Monday, Octave.
4th
Mass 7-15. At 11-30 Mother took Sister D. Anthony to Waverley, she having returned from Hillcrest earlier in the morning. Mother had a meeting at Waverley in the afternoon. Mr Macaulay & Margaret came to stay.
- Tuesday, Octave.
5th
Mass 7-15. In the morning Mother took Alberta to the Convent. Sister Ida left for Bloemfontein for her Retreat. In the afternoon we had a wire from St. Cuthbert's telling us of Sister Toeolina's 55 yrs. sudden death. In the Evening a Mr Bent came to see Mother sent by the Bp. of Pretoria.
- Wednesday, Octave Mass 7-15. Fr. Shelley C.R. came for Confession, Day of Peter & Paul. Fr. Evans still ill. Girls Service 6-15 p.m.

Thursday October 8th. No Mass. The Chaplain went to the Hospital about his throat & had it scraped under an anaesthetic with the result that he was forbidden to do anything until Tuesday! A hunt for Priests again to say Mass! Monica K. Arch came to stay from "Eh". The girls had Festival dancing at 6 p.m.

Friday October 9th. 8th No Mass, owing to the Chaplain being unable to come. Sister Marjorie ssm. came out of Retreat. Monica Kerr well in Retreat. Sister M. Anthony, & Sister Angela went in on the Van for shopping. Girls Classes as usual. Dora Baker went home for the week end.

Saturday 9th
Octave Day. Mass 9-15. Fr. King from St. Boniface, Crowsiton. Monica Arch left, M^m Macaulay & Margaret went into Johannesburg for the day. No Evening as the Chaplain was not allowed to use his voice. Mother took a short service for the girls.

Sunday. 10th
Trinity IV. Sung Mass 7 a.m. Fr. Anderson or the Sister Joan Kindly drove over from the School to take the Mass. A quiet Sunday. No Evening as Mother took a short service for the girls at 6-30 p.m. Sister Marjorie ssm. left in the morning, and Sister Margaret Anthony after dinner.

Monday. 11th Mass 9-15. Fr. French-Bentagh. Mother in Retreat. Dora Baker returned.

Tuesday. 12th. Mass 9-15. The Chaplain. A much colder day. Sister Isobel Everild returned from Bloemfontein. Sister Olive Frances went in on the Van to shop. Sister Beatrice Rose & Elsa? came for Retreat.

Wednesday. 13th Mass 9-15. Mother spent most of the morning in Court with Alberta. S. B. Rose, & Elsa
