We have been doing our he st to get the New Zealand authorities and the New Zealand Football people not to omit Maoris from their team visiting South Africa next year. We actually succeeded in getting the West Indies to cancel the proposed visit of their colour-bar team to South Africa, and we are now trying to exercise pressure on the British Empire Games Committee. As you know, our white Olympic authorities gave an assurance that no non-white South African would be excluded on grounds of colour, but I may say that we are very suspicious of this undertaking.
