## St. Benedict's Hospital, Nkandla

#### ANNUAL REPORT

Although the cause of much worry and anxiety, Nkandla Hospital has progress to record which may be on a smaller scale than the other hospitals, yet not of less merit. The number of admissions rose in the course of the year from 88 to 142 including 37 maternity cases. The Return of Diseases shows that the hospital played its part nevertheless, nobly giving relief in proportion to its strength under abnormally difficult circumstances. Credit is first and foremost due to the Sister-in-charge for her magnificent and untiring efforts. We express our gratitude to Dr. G. Abel for his services to the hospital.

During 1941 a Hospital Board was founded and the Magistrate of Nkandla was duly elected chairman. This honour is due to him since, from the very beginning he urged the necessity of building district hospitals and encouraged us to meet this demand by erecting a hospital.

The hospital is still a private establishment without any assistance whatsoever. Neither the Native Affairs Department nor the Provincial Administration nor

Public Health Department could see a way of giving financial support to our hospital. Therefore we are all the more grateful for a donation of £25 from the Native Recruiting Corporation and £5 from Mr. Harvey, Nkandla. The running of the hospital has been a heavy burden; for to continue hospital work for the natives without receiving support from the Government is a serious problem. But it is a painful, not to say a bitter feeling to know that we are neglected for reasons not in keeping with the professed aim of aiding the suffering, a principle held in common by all interested in health and social welfare.

I hope that our efforts and endeavours will be increasingly fruitful and will also be acknowledged and appreciated by all and as far as possible materialised.


