Sir,

As I told you that I had to meet the Barolong People at a conference of all Free-Staters which I attended - you will see the report in the last page of the paper sent to you.

Mr Nyokong is a bit upset. He says he expected to hear from you as soon as you arrived home. This morning he even asked Mr Fenyang to write and ask you what has happened because time is running out. I will be very happy if the Thaba-Nchu people can be encouraged to do good; in this way they will save me from the difficulties (problems) I am confronted with in England. If we delay our assistance, they will say it's too late and unfortunately I will be left alone with this problem.

Do please write to Mr Fenyang and tell him how things are that side.
