## RECULATIONS FOR THE NATIVE ADVISORY BOARD •

 INTERORETATIONOFTERMS.1. In these regulations, unless inconsistent with the context :"BOARD"
: shall mean the Native Advisory Board. "BY-EIECTION" : shall mean an election for a casual vacancy or vacancies occurring on the Board at any time other than a general election:
"COUNCIL" : shall mean the City Council of ............. "GENERAL ELECTION: Shall mean an election of all members of the Board in consecuence of the expiry of the period for which they were elected.
" ..NATIVE VILLAGE:shall mean the ...................................... "MANAGER" : shall mean the person who holds the appoint ment for the time being in terms of section 20 of the Native (Urben Areas) Act (No. 25 of 1945) as amended.
"OCCUPIER" : shall mean the sole hire-purchaser, lessee or tenant of a stand, erf or building and shall not include a lessee of a portion of an undivided stand or a tenant of a room or rooms.
"POLLING OFPICER" : shall mean any person appointed by the Native Commissioner of ................... to carry out the duties assigned to polling officers by these reg lations and shall include the Deputy nd Assistint Polling Officer.
"RETURNING OFFICER: shall mean any person, including his deputy and assistant, appointed by the Native Commissioner of to carry out the duties assigned to a returning officer by these regulations.

## MEMBERSHIP.

2. The .............. Advisory Board shall consist of 1 member for each block, elected in the manner hereinafter prescribed, and a. chairman appointed as provided in Regulation 3 of these regulations.

## CHATRIIAN AND SECRETARY.

3. The Chairman, of the Non-European Affairs Committce of the .....................City Council shall cx officio be the Chairmon of the Native Idvisory Board. He shell heve no vote. In the absence of the chairmen from any mocting, an"- momber of the NonEuropoan Affairs Committoc of the Council, nominoted by the Chairman of such Comittoc, or any porson apnointed in his placo, shall act as Chairman of that meeting.

A Sceretary to the Boord shell bo appointed in onch year from among the mumbers at the first meeting of the Board during that year.

QUALIFICATIONS OF MEMBERS OF BOARD.
4. iny porson :-
(a) Whose neme appears on the voters' list montioned in Regulation 15 of thesc regulations ;
(b) Tho is resident in the block for which he stends, and
(c) Tho has resided within the municipal arce of ............ continuously for n period of not less then two veers immediately prior to the lst Jonuery of the rear in which 0 Gencrol or By-Election is hold, sholl. be oualified to be electod $\therefore$ mombor of tho Board.

## DISQUALIFICATIONS OF MEMBERS OF BOARD :

5.(a)No person who has been convicted of murder, assault with intent, culpable homicide, incitement to public violence public violence, troason, sodition, fraud, robbcry, pcrjury - common law or statutory, rape or indecent assault;
and no person who within two years of nomination has been convicted of any crime and sentenced to imprisonment for more than seven days without the option of a finc and,
(b) No person of unsound mind ceclored as such by a competent court, and no person who is in arrear with the payment of any rates, taxes or foes duc and owing to the Council for a period of six months or longer, shall be capable of being clected, and if elected of continuing to be c momber of the Board.
(c) Any momber of the Board who shall absent himsclif from the . urban area of .............. for a period excooding three months without first heving obteined lec.ve of absence from the Board, or who shall without first having obtained loave of absence from the Board, fail to attend three consecutive ordinery mectings of the Board, shall ceasc to possess the qualifications of a momber and the provisions of Rugulation 6 shall apply to such momber.

CIRCUMSTANCES IN WHICH A MEMBER OF THE BOARD
V.C.ITES HIS OFFICE.
6. Any momber who shall coase to possess the cualifications by these rogulations recouired or who sholl beconc discualificd by these regulations, shall ipso facto vacate his office, and the Chairman shall at the noxt moeting of the Board declore any such vacancy which may have occurred : and in casc any porson elected a momber shall become disqualified under these rogulations or coase to be qualified to be a member, or shall resign or sholl rofuse to accopt the office of a momber, thon such vacancy sholl forthwith be fillcd up in the monner directed by these regulations, but subject novertheless to the provisions horeinafter made as to vacancics occurring within threc months of the General Election referred to in Regulation 20(ii).

## QUALIFICATION OF VOTERS:

7. Evcry native and coloured person who is a registered owner or occupier of land or buildings in the
arca shall, subject to the discualifications hercinafter set out be cntitled to be enrolled on the voters: list for the said area ; provided that no person shall at eny time be enrollod on the voters' list for more than one block or in more then one erca within the municipality in respect of which a soparate board or boards have been constituted.

## WHO MAY VOTE :

8. No person whose neme does not appeer on the voters' list for the time being in force shell be entitled to vote at eny election under these regulations.

## DISOUALIFICATIONSOF VOTERS :

9. The following porsons shall not be entitled to be enrolled on the voters' list for the ......................... Area nor qualified to vote at any eloction hold under those rogulations :-
(a) iny person, who on the ...................... in the year in which a Goneral Elcction is held, sholl bo indcbted to the Council in any amount in rospect of retos, toxes and foes duce to tho Council, for a period of throc months or longer, and
(b) Any person who is convicted of any crime montioned in Regulation $5(a)$ and sontonced to imprisonment without the option of a finc for a period of more then soven days.

## DIVISION OF ARE: INTO BLOCKS :

10(a) hs soon as possible after the promulgation of these regulations the Council shall cause tho ...................... Area situated in the Municipol Area of ................. to be divided into ............... blocks.
(b) is soon as possible after detcrmination of the said boundaries, a description of the blocks shall be posted up in the official languages and such nativo longuage, as the Mnnager shall consider necessory at the ...................... Municipal Offices and at such other places as he shall direct. The blocks as dofined in such notice, shall come into operation from the dete of the said notice.

INCREASE OR DECREASE OF BLOCKS AND
ALTERITIONS OF BOUNDi.RIES :
11. The Council may, after the ......................... irca has been divided into blocks as provided in the proceding rogulation, from time to time increase or docreese the number of such blocks, or cause the bounderics of any cxisting blocks or block to be altcred.

## MIKING UP OF VOTERS: LISTS :

12(a) The Council shall not letor then the ...... der of of cvery year in which a Gencral Election is to be hold, cause a list to be made of all persons whoso nomes as at the ..... day of .............. of that year, apear as owners or occupiers in the .............. registers, who are to the bost of the Council's knowledge cualified to be enrolled on the voters ${ }^{\text {i list under }}$ Regulation 7, read with Regulation 9: hereof. The said list shell be subdivided into as many parts as there are blocks in the said area and each part shall show in alphabetical order the naries, and residential address of evory voter within the block to which such part refers.
(b) Whenever the number of blocks of the area havo boen increased, decreased or the boundaries altered or otherwise edjusted, the Council shall as soon as possiblo aftor such increase, decroase, altoration or other adjustment causc such alteretions of tho votors list to be made as may bo necossary to show in oach pert thoroof (ropresenting the various blocks of tho Aroa) the porticulars of votors residing in oach block.
13. The Manager shall causo every list framed under Regulation 12 hereof to be posted up at the ................... Municipal Oifices, together with 2 . notice that all objections thereto or clains to be enrolled thereon must be lodged with him within seven days of the date which such list is posted up at the said offices. Copies of such provisional list shall be supplied at the said offices on application and upon payment of $1 /$ - per copy.

## DETERMINATION OF OBJECTIONS :

14. The Town Clerk or an officiol appointed by him sholl consider and determine all clains and objections and may enroll the names of any voters who have been omitted from the voters' list, end strike out the names of all persons not entitled to be enrolled ; Provided that no person's nome shall be struck out until such person shall have had two clear days' notice of the investigation of his cualification and sholl be heard in regard thereto, should he so desirc.

The docision of the Town Clerk or person appointed by him shall be final in regard to all clains to be enrolled or objections made in torms of this Regulation.

## VOTERS ${ }^{\prime}$ LIST TO RBMiIN IN FORCE UNTIL NEMT <br> ONE IS COMP LTTED.

15. The list, when completed as provided in the proceding regulation 14, shall be certified by the Town Clerk, or person a:pointed by him and sholl thereaftor, subject to the provisions of Regulation $12(b)$ hercof bo the final voters' list of the area until the next roll shall in like menner be completed.

Copies of such final votcrs' lists sholl bo supplied
at the .................... offices, to any porson upon poyment of $I /-$ per copy, provided that any person who has alroady purchased a provisional list, sholl bo ontitled to a copy of the
final list free of charge. The inadvertent omission from or inclusion in a voters' list of any name which should not have been omitted or included, as the case may be, shall not invalidate any election.

## VOTERS IN EIECTION TO VOTE IN BLOCK IM THICH REGISTERED. <br> $\qquad$

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16. No person who is qualified to vote in torms of these regulations shall, in the event of any General or By-Election in the area to which these regulations shall apply, vote in or in respect of any block, othor then the block in which ho is registered on the date of such General or Bymelection.

## PENAITIES FOR HOLDING OFFICE OR <br> VOTING WHEN DISQUiLIFIED :

17. Any person who is qualified in all respects, but who is discualificd in terms of Regulation 5(a) hercof, and who shall vote on any General or By-Election held under these regulations, or shall hold office as a momber of the Board constituted under these regulations, shall be guilty of an offence and liable on conviction to a finc not cxcecding $£ 15$ or in defoult of payment to imprisonment with or without hard labour for a period not exceoding threc months, and if he bo a momber of the Board he shall immediatcly vacatc his scat and his seat shell thereupon become vacant.

## GENER 1 L ELICTION OF NWMBERS OF BO $\wedge_{\perp} R D$ :

18. A General Election of mombers for the ............ irea shall be held on and on $\qquad$ in every sccond year thereaftor.

19.(1) Every member elected at © General Election shall, unless he becomes otherwise disqualified or dies or resigns his office, remain in office until the next General Election...

19(2) Evory nember clected at 2 By-Election shall, unless he becomes othorwise discunlified or dies or resigns his office, romain in office for the period his predecessor would have renained in office.

## CiSU能L ViiCiNCIES :

20(i) Save as is provided in paragraphs (a) and (c) of Regulation 23 hereof, a casual vacancy shall be docned to mean any vacency oxcopt c: vacancy caused by the retirement of a momber on the expiry of the poriod of office for which he was clected.
(ii) Whon and as often as any casual vacancy shell occur... on the Board, the member to be elected to fill such vacency shall, savo as provided in Regulation 22 (b) hereof, be clocted in a manner provided for the election of condidates at the General Election ; but if such veconcy shall occur within three months of the ensuing General Election then the vacancy shall not be filled up at a By-Election but sholl romain until the holding of the General Election of members under these Regulations ; Provided always thet such vacancies do not exceed three in number, in which case they shall be filled up at a By-Election held for the purpose.

NOTIFIC.ITION OF VACLTION OF OFFICE BY IEMBER OF BO ADD :
21. The occurrence of any casual vacancy in the Board which is not recuired to je declared by the Chairman at a meetins of the Board under the provisions of Regulation 6 shall be notified by the Manager by a notice signed by him and posted up at the ................. office and eny casual vacency shell be cleemed to occur at the date which such veconcy is declered by the Chairmen under the said regulation or notified by the Manager under this rogulations.

## THE DATE OF NOMINATION :

22. (a) GENERAL EIECTION :

Nominations for the election of members of the Board shall bo submitted in writing to the Returning Officer between the hours of $8 \mathrm{~A} . \mathrm{M}_{\text {. }}$ and $4.30 \mathrm{P} . \mathrm{M}_{\text {. }}$ on the ........ day of ...... in the yoar in which a Gencral Election is hold. If the first day of ........ bo a Saturday, Sunday or Public Holiday, nominations shall be lodged on the proceding full working doy, Nominations shall be in such form as the Returning Officer mey direct and shall be lodged at such place as he may designate.

## 22. (b) NOMINATION IN CASE OF CASUAL VACANCIES :

In the case of an clection to fill a casual vacnncy on the Board, the Returning Officer shall by written notice posted up at the Office, coll for nominations, to be submitted to him in writing, allowing a. period of not less than seven days from the date of the notice to call for submission of such nominations. If a poll is necessary, he shell thereafter by written notice posted up at the ............... offices give not less than 14 days notice of the polling date, the hours of the polls and tho polling station.

## MANNER OF NOMINITIONS :

23.(a) No person shall be a candidatc at any election or be qualified to be clected a member of the Board for any block of the area to which these Regulations apply, unless his nomination shall be supported by the signatures or merks of at least 10 persons whose names appear on the list of voters for the block for which the nomination is made.
23.(b) If only one candidate is nominated for any block the Returning Officer shall by writton notice posted up at the ...... Municipal Offices, declare the person so nominated for that Block, to be elected and if such nomination is in respect of a casual vacancy such candidato shall bo token to have boon olected
on the day of the nomination.
23. (c) If more then one nominetion has boen received for any block the Returnin Officer shell by written notice posted up at the ............. Municipal Offices give notice of a poll, the number of vacencies to be filled, and the place or ploces where the poll will be taken. i. poll shall take place accordingly and shall be held between the hours of $\delta \mathrm{A} . \mathrm{M}_{0}$ end I P.M. and 2 P.M. and 10 P.M. on the same day.
23. (d) Vithin seven days after the nominations heve been reccived by the Returning Officer he shall cause to be posted up at the ..................... Municipal Offices a list of the nominated candidates whose nominations are accorrtcl by him a.s valid. Should any nominations be declared invalid by the Returning, Officer, he shall specify, in a notice apended to such list, the names of the candidates so discualiffed, together with his reasons for such discualification.
23.(e) Dach and every candidate for election shall, tofether with his nomination paper, deposit the sum of $\& 5$ (five pounds) with the returning officer who shell issue a recoipt therefor. If a poll has to be taken any nominated candidate unless he withdraws his nomination in writing to the Returning Officer 3 days before polling day or obtains one fifth or more of the number of votes recorded by the successful cendidate in such block, such nominated candidate in such block shall forfeit his deposit to the Council's Native Revenue ficcount.

## CiSUAL VACiNCIES IN CERTAIN CIRCUMSTiNCES.

24.(a) If no nominations are received the vacancy shall be deemed to be a casual vacancy which shall be filled in accordance with the provisions of regulation 20(ii).
24.(b) If aftor further nominations have been called for to fill. such casual vacancy no nominations are received, it shall be lawful for the Council to appoint ony person who complies with
provisions of regulation 7 of these regulations to be a member of the Board to make up the number of members recouired.
24.(c) If, after the polling day has been fixed for an election in any block, any duly nominated candidate dies before the poll has comenced, the returnin officer shall, upon being satisfied of the fact of the death, withdraw so far as it concerns that block, the notice fixed for the polling day, and all proceedings relating to the said election sholl be commenced afresh in precisely the same manner as if a casual vacancy has occurred ; Provided that no fresh nomination shall be necessary in the case of a candidate who was duly nominated at the time when the said notice was withdrawn.

## ELECTION ARRANGEMENTS :

25. For the purpose of any election there shall be one polling station at some convenient place within each block. The returning officer shall by written notice posted up at the
............... Municipal Offices specify the places where the polling stations she.ll be.

For ell elections the returning officer shall provide such compartments, desks, ballot papers, ballot boxes, copies of register of voters and do such other acts and things and make such arrangements to facilitate the taking of the poll as he may deen advisable for effectually conducting the election.

## POLIING OFIICERS :

26. The polling officer at the polling station shall keep order thereat, shall regulate the number of voters to be admitted at a time and shall exclude all other persons excet the returning officer, the candidates, the scrutineers of candidates and the personnel on duty.

ENQUIRIES AS TO RIGHT TO
VOTE :
27. No enouiry shall be made at any election as to the right of any person to vote, excopt that the polling officer máy "put 12/0....
to every voter the following questions :-
(1) Are you the person whose name appears as
.............. on the voters' list in this
Block ?
(2) Have you already voted at this election in the capacity in which you now claim to vote ?

No person shall refuse to answer any such cuestion or who shall not answer the first of such cuestions in the affirmative and the second of such cuestions absolutcly in the negative shall be permitted to vote.

## PENALTY FOR FAISE ANSWER :

2ठ. Any person who shall wilfully make a false answer to any of these questions shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding $£ 20$ and in default of payment to a term of imprisonment not exceoding three months.

## EVERY VOTER TO HAVE ONE VOTE ONLY :

29. Every person shall have one vote and onc vote only.

## MANNER OF VOTING :

30. The Polling Officer, ofter satisfying himself thet the name of the person desirous of voting appears on the voters? list and that such porson has not alroady voted sholl initial a ballot paper on which shall be the names of the cendidates in alphabetical order and hand it to such person. The votor shall, either by himsclf in a polling box at the polling station, or with the help of the polling officer, place a cross opposite the name of the candidate for whom he wishes to vote and the voter shall place it in the bollot box provided.

SEALING OF BALLOT BOXES :
31. Every polling officer as soon as is practionhle after..the
close of the poll, shall before such candidates as shall be prosent, seal each ballot box.

The sealed ballot boxes accompanied by a statement made by each polling officer showing the numbor of bollot papors ontrusted to him and accounting for them under the heads of ballot papers in the ballot box and unused ballot papers shall thereaftor together with the unused be delivered to the returning officer.

## DECLARATION OF POLL :

32. Upon reccipt of the aforesaid ballot boxes from such polling officer by the returning officer the latter shall take charge of thom and shell, at $8.30 \mathrm{~A} . \mathrm{M}$. on the day after the poll, in the presence only of such candidatos as may be in attendance, open the ballot boxes and ascertain the rosults of the poll. He shall satisfy himsclf that only ballot papors, which have been initiolled by the polling officer and which have been properly merked in terms of rogulation 30 of these regulations are included for purposes of counting, and shall then proceed to count the votes cast in favour of each candidate. Thereafter he sholl declore elected the candidate who has reccived the greatest number of votes in each block.

In the event of two or more candidates for any block receiving an equal number of votcs, the election of the members shall be determined by the drawing of lots in the presence of the returning officer, whose decision shall be final. No candidate entitled to be present at the counting of the votes, shall be allowed to leave the room without the permission of the returning officer, until the announcoment of the result of the election. Immediatcly ofter declaration of the poll, the roturning officer shall cause to be posted up at the ............ Municipal Offices a notice signed by him and on which shall appear the nomes of the elected persons.

## APPOINTMENT OF SCRUTINEERS :

33. Any time after nomination and prior to ghe poll the returning officer shall call together all the nominated candidates and each may appoint one scrutineer for each polling station in the block for which he is a candidate. These scrutincers shall be ailowed inside the polling station to assist the polling officer in identifying the voters, but they shall not be purmitted to see how any voter casts his vote. In the absence of any such appointment, a candidate shall be his own scrutineer.

## ELECTION EXPENSES :

34. A candidate for clection to the Board shall not spend a sum of money in excess of $£ 5$ (five pounds) in conncction with his clection, and nonc of the moeny so expencied by him shall be spent upon the entertainment of voters or prospective voters in such elections. The returning officer moy coll upon ony candidatc, after an cloction, to account for such candidate's expenses in connection with such election. If any cendidate who has been elected at any election shall be found by the returning officer to havc infringod any provision of this regulation, the returning officer shall doclare such candidate to be unseated and procced to hold an clection in rospect of such candidate's seat on the Board in torms of the procedure laid down in paragraph (ii) of regulation 20 of these regulations.

Notwithstanding the existence of eny vacancy on the Board for any reason whatsocver the remaining members shall continue to function as if the Board were fully constituted and in such cventuality the quorum for any mecting shell be not less than half the romaining mombors.
