We did not process to St. Margaret's but the Bishop, Chaplain + Sisters processed round the cloister starting from the front door to the chapel singing hymn 208 S. M. C. was crucifer + Sr. Amette Crucifer after the chapel was blessed the Bishop proceeded to the dining room, and the girls who had been standing near the chapel went ground out to the front stoep. When all had been blessed all the Home girls went back and the sisters, Mrs. Gordon + the Bishop + Mrs. Furse went down to the cemetery to bless and dedicate the Calvary. The first verse of Loving Shepherd was sung and then the Bishop dedicated and censured the Calvary + then he censured James' grave after that was all finished he gave the sisters his blessing
