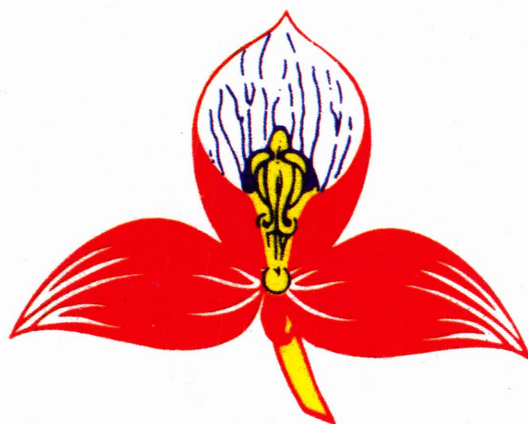

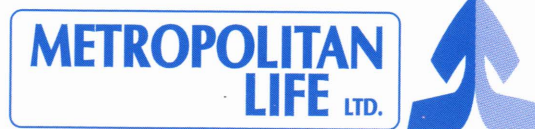

### **Message from the President Boodskap van die President**



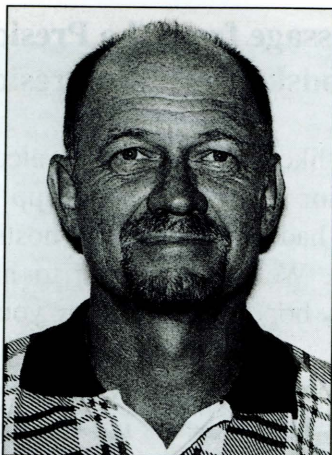

## CAPE TOWN SET TO PUT AFRICA ON OLYMPIC MAP

Situated in the heart of Cape Town - on the 26th floor of one of Cape Town's newest and most spectacular buildings - the Cape Town 2004 Olympic Bid diligently proceeds with what until recently could so easily have been laughed off as a misguided project - delivering an African Olympic Games.

Some way down the line now in terms of planning and preparation, no-one scoffs at Cape Town's bid any longer. After months of working furiously to self-imposed deadlines, the Cape Town Bid Company has emerged with Cape Town as a serious contender in the international race for 2004.

The same sense of urgency with which the process was jump-started early in 1995 by the appointment of CEO Chris Ball, has persisted apace to carry the Bid Company into its next important phase of consolidating all preparations into formal proposals to the International Olympic Committee. The centrality of time and deadline is vested in a tiny paper square to which all departments inadvertently pay daily homage. With spectacular window views on all sides, and Table Mountain a close neighbour, the distraction provided by this small poster on the north window is surprisingly competitive. The poster reads: "Days to filing". Each day, the figure reduces by one. Each day, the Company's confidence in the Bid becomes more resolute.

"The time has never been better for staging Africa's first Olympic Games. Cape Town's strength is that it offers the opportunity to do so in one of the most beautiful and friendly cities in the world - as well as in one of the world's youngest democracies."

Chris Ball, the banker charged with leading Cape Town's bid to stage the 2004 Olympic Games, scarcely conceals his enthusiasm as he explains the Bid Company's plans to bring the Olympic experience to Africa. As the company's Chief Executive Officer, Ball has gone on record in committing to a Games concept that would provide a model for other developing countries in the future. "It would be irresponsible to commit ourselves to a lavish event. Our bid takes place within a context - and we aim that our bid is based on sound financial principles, and it will contribute to the processes of reconstruction and development in both Cape Town and South Africa."

On 15 August 1996, the Bid Book outlining Cape Town's submission to host the 2004 Olympic Games will be presented to the IOC. Thirteen months later, one of the eleven candidate cities will be awarded custody of the Olympic spirit and the second Olympic Games of the new millennium. On that day, the people of South Africa - indeed of Africa - will be holding thumbs for two important words: Cape Town.
