APPEAL TO ALL OLYMPIC COUNCILS

Dear Sir,

The South African Sports Association wishes to appeal to your Olympic Council to support us in our fight to have racial discrimination in South African sport removed and to secure international recognition for all South African sportsmen.

The Association has written to the President of the International Olympic Committee asking that the matter of racial discrimination in South African sport be re-investigated by the International Olympic Committee.

This Association earnestly appeals to your council to support us in this action and to initiate action along similar lines in order to ensure that the matter is investigated.

A copy of our letter to the President, Mr Avery Brundage, is enclosed.

The South African Sports Association is a co-ordinating body supported by more than 70,000 sportsmen of all racial groups in South Africa and by the following affiliated and supporting non-racial sporting bodies - all of which are at present excluded from participation in international sporting events:

The South African Weightlifting and Bodybuilding Federation; the S.A. Softball and Baseball Federation; the S.A. Soccer Federation; the S.A. Netball Board; the S.A. Lawn Tennis Union; the S.A. Athletic and Cycling Board of Control; the S.A. Table Tennis Board, a supporting body which is a member of the International Table Tennis Federation has been prevented from participating in international events.

Further information will be gladly supplied on request and we hope to hear from your body in the near future.

Dear Sir,

The South African Sports Association wishes to have information with regard to the planned visit to South Africa of overseas tennis players under the sponsorship of your Company.

We would like to know whether these players will play against any non-white South African tennis players and whether there will be racial segregation in seating at events where they appear.

If there is any racial discrimination, we wish to protest formally. We request that such racialism be removed or that the players should not come to South Africa.

If there is racialism we propose to contact the players concerned and their national bodies and ask them to decline to come viz. Miss Maria Bueno (Brazil), Miss Darlen Hard (U.S.A.), Senor Manuel Santana (Spain) Mr Billy Knight (Gt. Britain) and Messrs Pilic and Javonic (Yugoslavia).

We trust you will let us have an early reply setting out the full details as we propose to contact the players concerned shortly.

Dear Miss Horrell,

The Bloemfontein Joint Council at its last meeting discussed the legislation which it is rumoured that the Government is likely to bring in regarding Sunday sport. We fear that if it is applied to African villages its effects may be very serious indeed. Ten Africans with no outlet at all for their energies may well be driven to illegal activities. We feel, too, that the serious bottleneck which is developing between the Primary and High Schools may well aggravate the position. It is expected in Bloemfontein that the only Bantu High School will be able to absorb only a fraction of the number who pass out from the Primary Svhools, and what are these children to do? There is not even a Library from which they can get reading matter. We would be glad to know if this is a matter of which the Institute is likely to take cognisance.

I shall be overseas for the greater part of next year, and my place as Secretary of the Bloemfontein Joint Council is being taken over by Mrs H. Wheals, whose address is P.O. Box 169, Bloemfontein.

I am directed to inform you that the Management Committee of the City Council, after taking into full consideration the representations made by your deputation on the 25th October 1962 resolved:

" That the Johannesburg Indian Sportsgrounds Association be informed that the Council will not agree to the South African Soccer League being permitted to use the Council's grounds at Natalspruit, and that these fields must be reserved for all forms of Indian Amateur and Professional sport; and that the Manager, Non-European Affairs Department be authorised to agree to the use of the ground on special occasions which in his opinion are justified".

It will now be necessary for your Association to enter into an agreement with this Department in regard to the terms of the conditions under which these grounds are to be developed and maintained by this Department, and used by your Association, in terms of the Committee's resolution and I suggest an early meeting between us in an effort to come to a final agreement.


