A daughter was born at 2 a.m. to Arthur & Paulina.

Mrs. Smith arrived before lunch & stays 2 nights. We all went over in the Opel & Leselin for meditation & confessions. S. R. M. gave us lovely ice-cream. S. V. R. drove the little car back & S. K. D. the Opel. We had a few letters telling us bits about the Installation & Chapter.

15th Octave Day of the Nativity.

Mrs Smith was taken to Bolando by Fr. Jenkins & returned
to her daughter from there. She left her ^{luggage} ~~baggage~~ behind.
S.D.J. called on the Kobe family & heard that Maatha
had had twins in the Bridgman on Sep. 6th.

We had a birthday tea-party for Mrs. Hughes whose
birthday was Sep. 8th.

A woman nearly had a baby here after labour but
it was not a straight-forward case so the Ambulance
men decided to sick-taken her to hospital. S.D.
helped them with her.

Miss Brown spent Holiday at Mt. Tuzigle.

Two fathers, Barbara & Nancy, went to Piraki of
Pangaroo

16th S.D. & S.D.J. went to the Bridgman to visit Maatha
Kobe & a woman who nearly had her baby here the
previous night. Then went on to town & took a parcel
for Mrs. Smith, our recent visitor, & he picked up at the
Church Book-shop. We were driven in by David Mamata,
a Nursery School parent on holiday. N. School Court at 2.30

17th Ev. Mass at 5.30. Molly Molefe came to see S.D.J.

We distributed invitations for Saturday to the Church Councillors
The Mothers' Union Committee came to see the N. School
kitchen & to make plans for their big festival.

18th S.V.R. & S.D.J. went to town to fetch croissants from
the Langham Hotel - waited for 1 1/2 hrs -

S.D.J. fetched Brownie from the Country Club before
going to Talitha. S.V.R. fetched Alfred's work
for showing at the Annual Meeting.

It was a School holiday & the children went to
Bavianskloof in buses. They assembled at 8 a.m.
& got off about 9.30. They returned late & a
child came in to have her head bandaged having been
attacked by tortois. S.V.R. took the party home to Talitha.

One bus was delayed & was very late. The parent waited in Mrs. Rajan's office - S. Ida fed them with biscuits & oranges. S.V.R. & S.D.J. took two parties of girls home in the two cars. S.D.J. got behind an Indian wedding in Muller St.

19th. The Annual General Meeting: S. Ida, Browne & S.D.J. went over to Leselies about 10.0 & left S. Ida behind to help. We all started off at 2 p.m. in two cars, taking Mrs. Malunga, Sally, Martha, Elsie & Robert, with us. The meeting was on the lawn and tea in a Marquee outside the gate. There were three items of entertainment, "Coration" by the Nursery School; Song by boys of S. Augustine's School and P.T. by girls of Holy Cross School - all very good especially the Singing: The Bishop was in the Chair and spoke very well & very boldly about the Western Areas Removal Scheme and the Education Bill. Mrs. Hoemle spoke, not so well as usual, and Father Sidebotham gave a good report speaking hopefully of our duties to go on in faith.

We returned in two parties after clearing up & claiming our various pots & pans. Mrs. Jowett stayed

to the P. O. Father H. brought in an interesting lady
& tea - a German Jewess whose home was now in
America, a friend of Meinolles belonging to the
German Congregational Church, lecturing here &
visited to give back a lecture in Germany. Miss
Ponsonby & her helper came in too.

In the afternoon S. D. J. fetched Martha Kober & her
baby home & visited Rachel Bombar about a job
& Mother Makomo about a burasany.

Ezekiel brought S. Ida back from retreat & took
Miss Brown to Mutuzya. At 5 p. m. brought Mrs. B.
back & took J. D. J. to Bolando - S. Esme's (mother)
& Leselin for a retreat.

23^d S. D. J. in retreat at Leselin. Mother P. came
over to see the sisters & to tell them that S. B. R.
was delayed in returning & S. Victoria Mary was
taking her passage to go to the D. S. G.

S. V. R. took S. Ida & Leselin for confession & brought
her & J. D. J. back. We were delayed by an accident
just outside Bolando. S. D. J. had supper in bed.

24th 5.30 Mass. S. V. R. & J. D. J. had breakfast at 7.10
& went off to Waverley for the Clothes Lines. S. V. R.
took two children to the Junior School & J. D. J. two to the
Senior School. All four were clothed at the
J. School where clothes had already come in in
quantities. Much joy on their return home to an
admiring crowd of Martha's Children.

S. D. J. took Mrs. Malunga & her second to see the
facilities at the N. School for the Mother's Union
Festival. S. Esme arrived Flea. Burasany
Committee meeting at 4.30 p. m. The Austin in dock
all day.

25th Miss Brown had a day in bed. Vera Hodges arrived

School vegetables, sent by mistake, were divided up between the Fathers, S. Esme, Alfred & ourselves. Sally brought her aunt-in-law who wants to go to Dick next year. Joyce Boutflower brought over the Willy's for us to keep in the Opel garage till the shop can take it. Kay Coakley & Alison Willis came to see Mr Kennedy & stayed to lunch. We had Recreation after dinner & Office at 7.45 - so as to get to bed early.
- 29th S. Michael & all Angels. Barbara still in retreat. High Mass at 6 a.m. S.I., S.D.J. & Vera went to Market & bought flowers as well as vegetable. S.D. & Vera decorated the Church for the Mothers' Union Conference which began at 2.30 p.m. S.I. & S.D.J. took Vera to the Station after supper. There was a Church Council meeting at 7.15 p.m.
- 30th Mothers' Union Conference. High Mass at 7.30 S. Esme & S. Editha came over for it & had breakfast in the Communion Room. Mr Reeves

had breakfast with Miss Brown in the refectory.
The meeting began at 10 a.m. Miss Maspero, Mrs.
Reever & Sister Sophia were there with the Bishop &
Dr. Hellmann who spoke on 'African Youth
between two worlds'. The ladies had buffet
lunch in the refectory & tea in S. Christopher.

Oct. 1. Sister Sophia stayed the night - Barbara provided
staple, straw, some cream for coffee.
Mass at 5.30 & 7.0 - Church full both
times. Meeting at 9.30. S. Sophia spoke on
the Mothers of the Future.

In the afternoon there was an impressive procession
of witness round Sphatone - Ray St, Victoria Rd,
Tucker St, Edward Rd & back to church where
the Bishop preached & then sang solemn Evensong.

Some European U. S. joined in - from S. Martin
& Geamiston & some Coloured women. Mrs. Henrick came.
They all departed soon after this. The Mothers cleared
up at the Nursing school where they had used all
three dormitories, the Kitchen & the Babies' Room.

2nd. Sheila Macaulay came for the week-end. S.D.J. fetched
her from the University at 3 p.m. She & S.D.J. slept at
the N. school.

3rd. The Sisters arrived back from Irene. S.M. Ant fetched
S.N. Anne & took back Selma to M. tuteyelo to work.

S.V.R. went over to M. tuteyelo & tea & fetched back
her first case taken by mistake. S.D.J. took

- 11th Trinitis XIX. S.V.R. brought Harold & Ethel & Eyekiel took them back. S.D.J. took S. Francis & S. Peter to school. 1st Vesper of the Dedication. Sweets at supper.
- 12th Buffan alarm what off at 11.30.
 Feast of the Dedication. Mass in Chapel. We went to bush for Meditation & Confession. & took a Kitten for Mutezele.
- 13th Mother Euphemia was fetched from Wareley by S.V.R. & taken to Mutezele for lunch. She had tea at Leseliny & S. Esme brought her here just before 6 p.m. while we were saying Compline. She stayed up for Recreation & then went to bed. There was a bad storm about 4 p.m. and we had to wait till 4.30 before taking Mrs. Hughes home.
