## LAVATORY ACCOMMODATION : NATIVES.

With reference to your letter of the 4th instant I have the honour to inform you that the Council has under consideration the question of the provision of lavatory accommodation for Natives at the Union Grounds and Ellis Park. Negotiations in connection with these matters have been completed and the necessary recommendations are being submitted to the Council through the responsible Committee.

For your information I have to state that the provision of a number of public conveniences, including public conveniences for natives, has been approved by the Council in respect of the following sites :-

Rossmore Park, Auckland Park; Bezuidenhout Valley Park; North Western Corner of Milner Park; Adjoining Yeoville Swimming Bath; Fotheringham Park; Frans Geldenhuis Park; Park in Ivy Road, Norwood; Ground East of Swimming Baths and Erin Street, Doornfontein; South Western Corner of Turffontein Racecourse; Rossettenville Corner; Near Sewage Pumping Station, Regents Park; Vicinity of Bree and Diagonal Streets, Old Magistrate's Courts.

The Public Health Committee, at its meeting held on 2nd instant decided to recommend to the Council that the Medical Officer of Health be given authority to set aside such number of public conveniences to which access for both Europeans and Non-Europeans shall be free, as in his opinion is necessary to preserve public health and decency.

In course of construction. (c). N.W. Corner of Milner Park. Negotiations are proceeding with regard to site. (d). Adjoining Yeoville Swimming Bath. In course of construction. (e). Fotheringham Park. Plans are in course of preparation. (f). Ground East of Swimming Baths and Erin Street, Doornfontein. Plans are in course of preparation. (g). S.W. corner of Turffontein Racecourse. Proposed site under consideration. Negotiations proceeding with regard to (h). Rosettenville Corner. site. (i). Near Pumping Station : Regents Park. In course of construction.
(j). North side of Union Grounds.
(k). Ellis Park.
(k). Ellis Park. (1). Vicinity of Bree and Diagonal Streets. Plans in course of preparation. (m). Old Magistrate's Court. The question of the transfer of control and the enlargement of existing conveniences is at present the subject of negotiations with the Government.

Alexander Park (Native Nurses only); Bedford Park Golf Course; Brixton Cemetery; Corner of Diagonal and Market Streets, Eastern Native Township; Hilson Park (Native Males only); Innes Road (Native Nurses only); Joubert Park; Kloof Road; Lang Street East (Native Nurses only); Market Square (Fordsburg) (Native males only); New Market, Newtown; Paterson Park (Native Males only;/ Phineas McIntosh Park (Native males only); Port Plein, City and Suburban (Native males only); Rhodes Park, Kensington (Native nurses only); Richmond Park (Natives males only); Rosebank Park (Native males only); Townsview Park (native Males only); Wemmer Sports Ground; Western Native Township (Inside Township - three); Western Native Township (First and Second Gates); Zoological Gardens, Zoo Lake Grounds.
