In a letter dated January 4, 1967, the Hem. the Minister of Justice and of Prisons adviced me to apply to you for permission to visit Robert M. Schukwe on Robben Jaland.

The resease for my wishing to visit Mr Sobukue are as follows:

- 1. Since his detention on the Seland, I have supplied him with his entire clothing meeds, bedding, etudy books, reading material, records and fresh fruit. Although I correspond with him, it is difficult to be certain from this method of communication, whether his seeds are being fully met. I om therefore anxious to see him, so as to accertain what his requirements are. Mr Sobulus tends to be reluctant to sek for anything, and my experience has been that it is necessary for me to confront him percently to loars what he needs.
- 2. I have known Mr SobuRwe for many years. He became a friend of mise when he was a lecturer at the University of the Witwatererand and before his actual envolvement in politics. I therefore have a natural interest in his and a desire to see him again.

I would like to stress that my visit to Mr Sobukue will be entirely private. As I told be the Hea. the Minister in my original letter to him, no publicity what-soever will be given to my visit.

As you will know, I have been allowed to visit Mr Sobukwe on the Island on six occasions in the past.

I am presently in Cape Town for only a few days as my home is in Johannesburg. If convenient to you, I would like to be able to visit the Island on Thursday, February 16. If at all possible I would also like to have syleit on Monday February 20.

As arranged, I shall telephone your office on Tuesday afternoon or Wednesday morning of mext week in connection with this matter.
