- Mon. 3rd: Capt. Piers from Glenorm Castle visited us p.m.
- Tues. 4th: S.G. & S.C. went to Town. S.E. bathed a.m.
- Wed. 5th: S.A. & S.E. to Town to visit Hetty Hoskyn & her new baby.
- Thurs. 6th: F. of the EPIPHANY. Cold & cloudy. High wind all day: did not go out much. FORM IV RESULTS CAME 5 passed out of 8.
- Fri.: 7th: Fine again. (S.A. Louisa & S. Annette sailed from Capetown.)
- Sat. 8th: All day Picnic to Mahoon River mouth. De Locke took us at 10 & fetched us at 5.30 (15/-) a very delightful day: plenty of shade. Carnival in Town so N. River almost deserted.
