

Vladivostok 12th Aug. 1929.

Dear Mama.

I received your letter with enclosure of Hilda's letter. I am glad to hear that you are all well. I am quite aware of all your troubles. I am sorry however that I am unable to do anything more. I do hope that Vera will succeed in getting in. All those matters that worry you so much: about the change of name etc. is of great importance. That will all pass. I know that it is unpleasant, but as it can't be helped it is of no use worrying about it. I am leaving for Okhotsk today by train via Khabarovsk. You shall hear from me as soon as I arrive. I am feeling well, and will write you again from Khabarovsk.

During the rest of the time it will be difficult to correspond, as the post is rather scarce to Okhotsk. However from time to time I will telegraph you, as well as post you as much as possible. You can keep on at intervals and maybe I will get your letters.

Do not worry. Your allowance will be transmitted regularly. It sometimes gets held up temporarily but it is always sent out.

Give my love to all our good friends.

I am writing Hilda separately, and will write Vera ~~separately~~ love Jane.
