Thur: July 1<sup>st</sup> S. Superior & S. Rose went to shop.

Monday 7<sup>th</sup> Agnes the native girl came early in the morning to do the house & kitchen work etc. Sr. Emily C.R. came to dinner & spent the afternoon here. Mr. Hewitt looked in for a few minutes.

Tuesday 8<sup>th</sup> Miss C. & S.M.C. to Mass. Weather rather cold & inclined to be wet.

Wed. 9<sup>th</sup> Miss C. & S.M.C. went over to East London. Did a little shopping had lunch there. Spent time to Evensonf & Intercessions.

Friday 11<sup>th</sup> A good deal of rain yesterday & during the

Monday 17<sup>th</sup> All to Mass. Sr. Mary Joyce in Retreat  
Came back in the morning. Rain afterwards.

Tuesday 18<sup>th</sup> All to Mass. Rain at breakfast, cleared up

March at 9.30. Miss C. & she went over to E. London with S. H. J. & said Good bye to her at the Y.W.C.A. Miss C. some had lunch at The Waterley & then went down to Sandy Beach. She bathed; returned to tea at 3.30. W. J. Gurn Post Master of E. London called about 5. p.m.

Wednesday. Bkt to Mass. Red up the garden & planted some potatoes, French Beans, Broad Beans, Beetroot & lettuce, also a row of sunflowers. Some to Eversong.

Maundy Thurs. Bkt to Mass. Some met Mrs Gibbs in the morning, went round her garden & looked at her pigeons.

Good Friday. Bkt to Litany at 7.30. Matins & Mass of the Precansecrated at 10. a.m. Mr Hewitt took the Three Hours Devotion. Stations of the Cross at 7.30.

Holy Sat. Went round to the church in the afternoon. Washed the Sacred Vessels in the font, had tea at the Rectory afterwards.

Easter Day. To Mass at 8 a.m. High Mass 11 a.m.  
Solemn Eversong 7.15.

Easter Monday. Bkt to Mass. Met the Good Shepherd girls outside the Park at 2.30. Had a picnic tea

in a very secluded port under the trees, sky looked threatening about 4.30 several peals of thunder, came back to West Bank by taxi.

Taster Tues. Some to Mars. Spent morning on the rocks, paddling about. Mr Hewitt came to tea & brought some roses. Went on to rocks again afterwards.

Wed 30<sup>th</sup> Some boated after breakfast. Then both packed up provisions & had lunch & boat at Shelly. Very windy but sheltered by rocks. Paddled about & dined. Some to Everson.

Thurs 31. Some boated. after dinner both went to Edson & bought a spade, sickle, etc. -

April 1<sup>st</sup> Fri. Some boated Rented boat to Benediction

Sat. 2<sup>nd</sup> Breakfast 6.45. Some met 7.15 train but Sr Paul & Frederica did not arrive, met rest of train at 10.5. with no better result. Some boated. More & letters arrived at 10a. explaining travellers would arrive next Wed. 21
