Defence - 13 of 1912

Liability for Service in Time of War

1. Subject to the provisions of this Act, every citizen shall be liable between his seventeenth & his sixtieth year (both included) to render in time of war personal service in defence of the Union in any part of S.A. whether within or outside the Union.

Liability to Peace Training

2. Subject to the provisions of this Act, every citizen shall be liable to undergo the course of peace training for military service in the Defence forces of the Union

Every citizen may be required to commence that training in his twenty-first year, and to complete it not later than his twenty-fifth year, but a citizen may voluntarily commence that training in any year between his seventeenth year & his twenty-first year (both included) & shall complete it in the fourth year from the year of commencement.
