Liability for Service in Twie of War.

1. Subject to the provisions of this Oct, every citizen.

Liability to Peace Training

2. Subject to the provisions of this act, every extraining that he hable to undergo the course of peace training for inclifery service in the Defence forces of the Union . . . . . . . .

Every citizen many be required to commence that training in his twenty-first year, and to complete it not later than his twenty-fifth year, but a citizen may voluntarily commence that training in any year between his seventeenth year a his twenty-first year (both included) a shall complete it in the fourth year from the year of commencement.
